AN ACT TO ADD NEW SECTIONS 10351 AND 10352 TO CHAPTER VI OF TITLE XI OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM RELATIVE TO EARMARKING THE LIQUID FUEL TAX FOR THE HIGHWAY FUND, CREAT-ING A HIGHWAY COMMISSION, AND AUTHORIZING THE GOVERNOR TO EXECUTE AN AGREEMENT UNDER THE FEDERAL HIGHWAY PROGRAM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM: Section 1. Sections 10351 and 10352 are hereby added to Chapter VI of Title XI of the Government Code of Guam to read as follows:

"Section 10351. Highway Commission. (a) There is created a Highway Commission.

(b) Membership. The Commission shall consist of the Director of Public Works, ex officio, who shall be chairman, and four members appointed by the Governor by and with the advice and consent of the Legislature. The appointed members shall serve for terms of three years, except that of the first appointed Commission one member shall be appointed for a term of one year and two members shall be appointed for terms of two years. The Chief Engineer for Highways, Department of Public Works, shall act as the Executive Secretary to the Commission.

(c) Duties and responsibilities. The Highway Commission shall review proposed short and long range public highway programs, specifications and standards, and refer same to the Territorial Planning Commission.

For WAL Section 10352. Territorial Highway Fund. ((a)the purpose of securing for the entire territory proper

maintenance and construction of existing public highways, including roads and city and village streets, and construction of needed new public highways, including roads and city and village streets, there is hereby established a fund to be known as the 'Territorial Highway Fund', which fund shall be maintained separate and apart from any other funds of the government of Guam, and independent records shall be kept in connection therewith.

(b) For the period beginning July 1, 1971, and ending July 31, 1973, all monies received under Subchapter D, Chapter 6, Title XX and Section 23354, Chapter 3, Title XXIV, Government Code of Guam and monies and revenue made available from the Federal government for public highway purposes shall be deposited with the Treasurer of Guam, and credited to the Territorial Highway Fund. Accounting procedures for the funds shall be prescribed by the Director of Administration and suitable reserves shall be maintained for tax drawbacks under this Subchapter which shall be paid from the Fund.

Monies deposited in the Territorial High-(c) way Fund shall be expended only after appropriation thereof are made by the Legislature and upon vouchers properly certified by the Director of Public Works for the purposes of acquisition of rights-of-way, planning, designing, constructing, reconstructing, improving, repairing, and maintaining of public highways, including roads and city and village streets. The Director of Public Works shall quarterly render an accounting of transaction of the Fund to the Governor and the Legislature. Accounting procedures

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for the Fund shall be prescribed by the Director of Administration.

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(d) Monies deposited in the Territorial Highway Fund shall also be used to implement Title 23, United States Code, as it applies to Guam and the provisions of Public Law 10-109, Tenth Guam Legislature."

Section 2. The Governor of Guam is hereby authorized to enter into an agreement with the Secretary of Transportation, providing that the government of Guam (1) will design and construct a system of arterial and collector highways, including necessary interisland connectors, built in accordance with standards approved by the Secretary of Transportation; (2) will not impose any toll, or permit any such toll to be charged, for use by vehicles or persons of any portion of the facilities constructed or operated under the provisions of the Territorial Highway Program (23 U.S.C. Section 215); (3) will provide for the maintenance of such facilities in a condition to adequately serve the needs of present and future traffic; (4) will implement standards for traffic operations and uniform traffic control devices which are approved by the Secretary of Transportation.

Section 3. References to the General Fund in Bill 529 and Bill 71, Eleventh Guam Legislature on the effective date of this Act shall refer to the Territorial Highway Fund established by Section 1 of this Act.

Section 4. The appropriations "For Highways", Items III, A, 1, and III, A, 2, and III, B, of Section 1 of Bill 159 shall be made from the Territorial Highway Fund on the effective date of this Act.

Section 5. This Act shall become effective July, 1, 1971.

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
