

AN ACT TO COMPENSATE LANDOWNERS WHO  
HAVE NOT BEEN PAID FOR LAND TAKEN BY  
THE GOVERNMENT OF GUAM FOR PRIMARY AND  
SECONDARY ROADS IN GUAM AND TO AUTHO-  
RIZE APPROPRIATIONS THEREFOR.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Authorization for land taking. Notwithstanding  
3 any other provisions of law, the Director of Public Works is  
4 hereby authorized to acquire on behalf of the government of  
5 Guam either fee title to, or a perpetual easement of required  
6 width over those portions of the primary and secondary roads,  
7 existing as of January 1, 1971, of the territorial highway  
8 system to which legal title is still vested in private owners.  
9 In making such acquisitions, the director shall pay no more  
10 than the fair market value therefor and in the event a land-  
11 owner refuses the offer of payment tendered by the director,  
12 the matter shall be referred to the Attorney General for  
13 appropriate action under the provisions of the Code of Civil



1 Procedure relating to eminent domain. The Legislature hereby  
2 declares the acquisition of such rights of way to be in the  
3 public interest.

4 Section 2. Authorization for annual appropriations. There  
5 is hereby authorized to be appropriated annually, beginning  
6 with the fiscal year 1972 and ending with the close of fiscal  
7 year 1976, from the Unappropriated Surplus of the Territorial  
8 Highway Fund, the sum of not less than Five Hundred Thousand  
9 Dollars (\$500,000) to carry out the purpose of Section 1 of  
10 this Act.
