

CERTIFICATION OF PASSAGE OF AN ACT TO THE GOVERNOR

This is to certify that Bill No. 427, "An Act to require the Civil Service Commission to reclassify those persons employed by the government of Guam as Stevedores, Stevedore Leadingmen, and Stevedore Specialists, to increase their pay range and to increase the pay range of Winchmen, Assistant Cargo Handling Supervisors, and Cargo Handling Supervisors, and to provide the hourly wage for casual and temporary Longshoreman, Longshoreman Leadingman, Longshoreman Specialist, Winchman, Assistant Cargo Handling Supervisor and Cargo Handling Supervisor", was on the 20th day of October, 1971, duly and regularly passed.

AN ACT TO REQUIRE THE CIVIL SERVICE COMMISSION TO RECLASSIFY THOSE PERSONS EMPLOYED BY THE GOVERNMENT OF GUAM AS STEVEDORES, STEVEDORE LEADINGMEN, AND STEVEDORE SPECIALISTS, TO INCREASE THEIR PAY RANGE AND TO INCREASE THE PAY RANGE OF WINCHMEN, ASSISTANT CARGO HANDLING SUPERVISORS, AND CARGO HANDLING SUPERVISORS, AND TO PROVIDE THE HOURLY WAGE FOR CASUAL AND TEMPORARY LONGSHOREMAN, LONGSHOREMAN LEADINGMAN, LONGSHOREMAN SPECIALIST, WINCHMAN, ASSISTANT CARGO HANDLING SUPERVISOR AND CARGO HANDLING SUPERVISOR.

1 WHEREAS, although, under the provisions of Title V,
2 Chapters I and II of the Government Code of Guam, the Guam
3 Legislature has delegated to a Civil Service Commission
4 authority to classify persons employed by the government of
5 Guam and to establish pay ranges for such classifications as
6 are established, the Eleventh Guam Legislature recognizes that
7 it is beyond the constitutional competence of the Legislature
8 to permanently delegate its lawmaking authority concerning
9 persons employed by the government of Guam; now therefore

10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

11 Section 1. Notwithstanding any provisions of Title V of
12 the Government Code of Guam to the contrary, the Civil Service
13 Commission shall redesignate the position titles of Stevedore,
14 Stevedore Leadingman, and Stevedore Specialist, respectively,
15 to Longshoreman, Longshoreman Leadingman, and Longshoreman

1 Specialist, respectively, and reclassify the pay ranges as
2 follows:

3 Civil Service

7 8.022	Longshoreman Specialist	24

8 Section 2. Notwithstanding any provisions of Title V of
9 the Government Code of Guam to the contrary, the Civil Service
10 Commission shall reclassify the pay range of Winchman,
11 Assistant Cargo Handling Supervisor, and Cargo Handling Super-
12 visor as follows:

13 Civil Service

18 Section 3. All casual or temporary Longshoreman, Longshore-
19 man Leadingman, Longshoreman Specialist, Winchman, Assistant
20 Cargo Handling Supervisor, and Cargo Handling Supervisor shall
21 be paid the hourly wage at Step 2 of the Pay Range applicable
22 to those classified positions.

23 Section 4. All persons having their position, title and
24 pay range reclassified by Section 1 or Section 2 of this Act
25 shall remain at the same step which they held prior to such
26 reclassification.

27 Section 5. Notwithstanding any provisions of Title V of
28 the Government Code of Guam to the contrary, the reclassifi-
29 cation set forth in Section 1 and Section 2 of this Act shall
30 be effective upon the effective date of this Act.

1 Section 6. All laws which are unavoidably inconsistent with
2 this Act are repealed only to the extent of such unavoidable
3 inconsistency, and all executive actions which are unavoidably
4 inconsistent with this Act are superseded only to the extent
5 of such unavoidable inconsistency.

6 Section 7. Nothing in this Act shall preclude the Civil
7 Service Commission from maintaining or reassigning the pay
8 ranges of employees assigned pay ranges pursuant to this Act;
9 provided, however, that such pay ranges shall not be reduced
10 below those established by this Act.
