




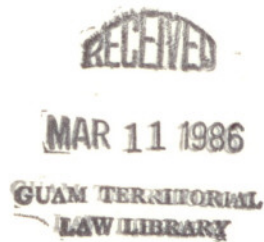

AN ACT TO RETURN THE UNENCUMBERED

TIONS FOR VARIOUS CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT
PROJECTS AND TO MAKE APPROPRIATIONS FOR
THE OPERATION OF THE COMMUNITY ACTION
AGENCY OF THE EXECUTIVE BRANCH OF THE
GOVERNMENT OF GUAM FOR THE CALENDAR YEAR

17 Section 2. There is hereby appropriated from any
18 available funds in the Unappropriated Surplus of the General
19 Fund the sum of Seventy Thousand, Two Hundred Seventy-Seven
20 Dollars (\$70,277) for architectural and engineering design and
21 construction of water and sewer facilities for Finegayan
22 Elementary School.

23 Section 3. There is hereby appropriated from any
24 available funds in the Unappropriated Surplus of the General
25 Fund the sum of One Hundred Sixteen Thousand, Seven Hundred
26 Sixty Dollars (\$116,760) for construction of water facilities
27 for Inarajan School.

28 Section 4. The following sums are hereby appropriated
29 from any available funds in the Unappropriated Surplus of the
30 General Fund for the operation of the Community Action Agency
31 for Calendar Year ending December 31, 1972.

10 Section 6. The following sums are hereby appropriated
 11 from any available funds in the Unappropriated Surplus of the
 12 General Fund for the operation of the Community Action Agency
 13 to supplement the appropriation made by Section 4 of this Act
 14 for Calendar Year ending December 31, 1972.

 28 projects, provided that no local funds are required.
