AN ACT TO REPEAL SUBCHAPTER E, OF CHAPTER II, OF TITLE X, OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM AND TO ADD A TITLE LXIII, CHAPTER I, TO SAID CODE TO ESTABLISH AN INDEPENDENT OFFICE OF THE PUBLIC DEFENDER, AND MAKING AN APPROPRIATION THEREFOR.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM: Section 1. Subchapter "E" of Chapter II, Title X of the Government Code of Guam is hereby repealed.

Section 2. A new Title LXIII, Chapter I, is hereby added to the Government Code of Guam to read as follows:

"Title LXIII

Public Defender

Chapter I

Section 58000. Public Defender. There is hereby established within the government of Guam the Office of the Public Defender of Guam. The Public Defender shall be appointed by the Governor and shall be a member of the Classified Service of the government of Guam with pay range 38. For purposes of performing his official duties, the Public Defender, the Deputy Public Defender, and the Assistant Public Defenders may practice before the courts of Guam on the same basis as other government attorneys under Section 28002.2, Government Code of Guam. No Public Defender shall be eligible for any local elective office within two (2) years after his relinquishment of the Office of the Public Defender.

Section 58001. Personnel. The Public Defender is authorized to appoint a Deputy Public Defender, Assistant Public Defenders, an Administrative Assistant, and such other personnel and fix their duties, under and in accordance with Title V, Government Code of Guam, as may be necessary for purposes of this Chapter.

Section 58002. Duties: Criminal cases. It shall be the duty of the Public Defender to defend indigent defendants charged in criminal cases before the courts of Guam, the determination as to whether a defendant be indigent and his referral to the Public Defender to be at the discretion of the judges before whom such defendant is appearing. The Public Defender may assist the judges of the courts of Guam in ruling on cases of indigency and in establishing criteria for determining whether the services of the Public Defender are appropriate.

Section 58003. Duties: Civil matters. The Public Defender shall render legal aid and assistance to those persons in the territory of Guam, who, under rules established by the Judicial Council of Guam, are in need of legal counselling and who are unable to afford an attorney in private practice. The Public Defender is not authorized to compete with attorneys engaged in the private practice of law in the territory of Guam and shall give legal assistance in civil matters only to those who would otherwise not receive such assistance.

Section 58004. Rules and regulations. The Public Defender shall make and may alter, amend or repeal rules and regulations as required to carry out the purposes of this Chapter which, after approval and promulgation by the Governor as Executive Order, shall have the force and effect of law."

Section 3. There is hereby appropriated from any available funds in the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund the sum of Six Thousand Dollars (\$6,000.00) for the rental of office space for the Public Defender.

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Section 4. All appropriations previously made to the Division of Public Welfare in the Department of Public Health and Social Services for the operation of the Office of the Public Defender are hereby transferred to the Office of the Public Defender established pursuant to this Act.
