AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 11205 OF THE
GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM TO PROVIDE FOR
FREE WORKBOOKS FOR STUDENTS IN THE
SCHOOLS OF GUAM.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Section 11205 of the Government Code of Guam
3 is hereby amended to read as follows:

4 "Section 11205. Free use of textbooks. The Board shall
5 provide for the use of textbooks adopted for use in the
6 public elementary and secondary schools of Guam, and allow
7 the use of the textbooks so adopted by all students in both
8 public and private elementary and secondary schools of
9 Guam without charge; provided that the Board shall have
10 the authority to sell such textbooks to any student
11 wishing to purchase the same; and provided further that
12 the term 'textbooks' shall include exercise books commonly
13 known as workbooks.

1 Students or their parents, guardians, or other
2 persons having control or charge over them, shall be
3 accountable for all books loaned to them, ordinary wear
4 and tear excepted, and the Board is authorized to adopt
5 reasonable rules and regulations pertaining thereto, and
6 to assess charges, not exceeding costs, for any book which
7 is lost, destroyed or damaged."
