A. A. Sekt T. S. Tanaka AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 11205 OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM TO PROVIDE FOR

FREE WORKBOOKS FOR STUDENTS IN THE SCHOOLS OF GUAM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. Section 11205 of the Government Code of Guam is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 11205. Free use of textbooks. The Board shall provide for the use of textbooks adopted for use in the public elementary and secondary schools of Guam, and allow the use of the textbooks so adopted by all students in both public and private elementary and secondary schools of Guam without charge; provided that the Board shall have the authority to sell such textbooks to any student wishing to purchase the same; and provided further that the term 'textbooks' shall include exercise books commonly known as workbooks.

Students or their parents, guardians, or other
persons having control or charge over them, shall be
accountable for all books loaned to them, ordinary wear
and tear excepted, and the Board is authorized to adopt
reasonable rules and regulations pertaining thereto, and
to assess charges, not exceeding costs, for any book which
is lost, destroyed or damaged."
