AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 25, 33, 35, 56 AND 69 OF THE CIVIL CODE OF GUAM, SECTION 397 OF THE PENAL CODE OF GUAM, AND SECTIONS 25203, 25208, 25308, 25308.1, 25318, 25318.1, AND 25519 OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM TO REDUCE: THE AGE OF MAJORITY FROM 21 YEARS TO 18 YEARS, AND TO CORRESPONDINGLY REDUCE THE AGE FOR DISAFFIRMING CONTRACTS BY MINORS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM: Section 1. Statement of Findings. The Legislature finds that many of the laws dealing with young persons in Guam are inconsistent, if not senseless. As examples, a minor 19 years old can drink alcoholic beverages but cannot buy a motorcycle on time, while a minor 18 years old can be drafted but cannot drink. This same 18 year old can'vote in local elections but cannot serve as commissioner. And most strange of all, if two 19 year olds are married to each other, the girl is considered an adult and can sign binding contracts and the like, but the boy is still a minor and is deemed in the eyes of the law to be incompetent and incapable of making a valid contract. In view of all these inconsistencies, the Legislature deems it necessary to reform the law by changing the age of majority from 21 to 13.

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his or her guardian, where such written consent is 1 filed with the Director of Administration, as provided 2 in Section 69 of this Code, is capable of consenting 3 to and consummating marriage. Provided, further that 4 5 any female under the age of sixteen (16) years and 6 over the age of fourteen (14) years, with the consent in writing of her parents or one of her parents, or 7 8 of her guardian, where such written consent is filed with the clerk issuing the marriage license, as 9 provided in Section 69-of this Code and where, after 10 such showing as the Island Court may require, an 11 order of said Island Court is entered in the minutes 12 13 of the clerk of said Court, granting permission to said female to marry, is capable of consenting to and 14 consummating marriage." 15 15 Section 6. Section 69 of the Civil Code of Guam is hereby amended to read as follows: 17 "Section 69. Marriage licenses. (a) All persons 18 about to be joined in marriage must first obtain a 19 20 license therefor, from the Department of Administration, which license must show: 21 1. The identity of the parties. 22 23 2. Their real and full names, residence and place of birth. 24 3. Their ages and date of birth. 25 26 4. Their citizenship. 5. If an alien, whether a resident alien or 27 non-immigrant alien. 23 6. Number of previous marriages, wherever contracted 29 30 and how terminated, the occupation of the parties, maiden name of the female if previously married, the names and 31 - 3 -

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birthplaces of the parents of each, and the maiden name of the mother of each.

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(b) No license shall be granted when either of the applicants therefor is an imbecile, or insame, or who at the time of making the application or proofs herein required for said license, is under the influence of any intoxicating liquor, or narcotic drug. If the applicant is under the age of eighteen (18) years, and such person has not been previously married, no license shall be issued, unless the consent in writing of the parents of the person under age, or one of such parents, or of his or her guardian, is presented with the application, duly verified by such parents, or parent, or guardian, and such consent must be retained on file in the Department of Administration with such application, and the fact of consent must be noted in the license. No license to marry between first cousins, between an adoptive parent and an adoptive person, between a step-parent and a step-person, and between a guardian and ward, shall be issued without an order in writing from the Island Court. No license to marry shall be issued without an order in writing from the Island Court for any 'female between the ages of fourteen (14) and sixteen (16) in addition to the consent of her parents, or one of her parents, or guardian as heretofore provided. No license to marry shall be issued in any case for any male under the age of sixteen (16) or any female under the age of fourteen (14).

(c) Application for marriage licenses shall be made on a form prescribed by the Director of

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Administration and must be sworn to by both applicants before the Director of Administration or his deputy. No license shall be issued until after the expiration of five (5) days after the filing of the application. Such waiting period may be waived upon the order in writing of the Island Court granted for good cause shown.

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(d) For the purpose of ascertaining all facts mentioned or required in this section, the Director of Administration, or his deputy, may examine under oath, or require written affidavits from, the applicants for a license and as many supporting witnesses as he deems necessary. Such examination shall be reduced to writing and subscribed by all parties swearing to the facts therein. In the case of termination of a previous marriage by divorce or annulment, the applicant shall furnish a certified copy of the final decree of divorce or annulment. In the case of termination of a previous marriage by death of the spouse, the applicant shall furnish a certified copy of the record of death. If a certified copy of a final decree of divorce, annulment, or record of death as required herein is not available, the applicant may submit in lieu thereof an affidavit setting forth, in such form as the Director may require, the reason why it is not obtainable.

(e) Any application for a marriage license, and any allied document, on file with the Director of Administration, shall be open to public inspection.

(f) Any person who shall swear falsely to an application for marriage license, or who shall make or

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present any false affidavit, statement, or testimony in any proceeding under subsection (d), shall be quilty of a felony and shall be subject to a fine of not more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) or imprisonment for not more than five (5) years, or both.

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(g) No marriage license shall be effective nor shall it authorize the performance of a marriage ceremony after the expiration of sixty (60) days from the date of issuance of such license. This provision shall be printed on each license in prominent type.

(h) The Director of Administration, and deputies designated by him, are authorized to administer oaths in connection with the administration of this section.

(i) A fee of five dollars (\$5.00) shall accompany each application for a marriage license and shall not be refunded if the license is not issued or used. No marriage license fees collected by the government of Guam prior to the enactment of this subsection shall be refunded."

Section 7. Section 397 of the Penal Code of Guam is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 397. Alcoholic beverages, selling of, to minors. Every person who sells, gives or delivers to any minor under the age of 18 years, any alcoholic 25 beverage as defined in Section 25004, Title XXVI, Chapter 1, of the Government Code of Guam, in any quantity, whatsoever, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and shall, upon conviction thereof, be punished by a fine of not more than \$500 or by imprisonment for a period not exceeding 90 days,

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or by both such fine and imprisonment. Provided, that this section shall not apply to the parents of such children, or to guardians of their wards." Section 8. Section 25203 of the Government Code of Guam is hereby amended to read as follows:

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"Section 25203. Same: same: minors. The Board shall not issue a license of any class to a person . under eighteen (18) years of age."

Section 9. Section 25208 of the Government Code of Guam is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 25208. Same: same: near church, hospital, school. (a) The Board shall not issue an on-sale license for premises located within a distance of five hundred (500) feet from any church, hospital or public or private school of general education where persons under the age of eighteen (18) are taught, the measurements to be taken in a straight line from the center of the nearest entrance to the building used as . such church, hospital or school to the center of the nearest entrance of the premises for which a license is applied; except that the provisions of this section shall not prohibit the renewal of any valid on-sale license previously issued and in effect at the time of a subsequent construction or establishment of such church, hospital or school within five hundred (500) feet of such licensed premises, and provided that such licensed premises shall not subsequently be added to or enlarged; and provided that an on-sale beer licensee coming under this exception shall not thereafter be issued a general on-sale license. (b) Exception. Notwithstanding the provisions

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of Subparagraph (a) of this section, the Board may issue an on-sale license for premises located within a distance of five hundred (500) feet from any church, hospital or public or private school of general education where persons under the age of eighteen (18) are taught, if the Board finds that the premises to be so licensed are such that would not disturb the church services, or the hospital patients, or the school students, or detract from the peace and quiet of the neighborhood, and that the general benefit to the territory at large by the licensing of such premises would outweight any benefit to be derived from a strict enforcement of the prohibition. No such exception may be made if the presiding official of the church, hospital or school within the five hundred (500) feet distance does not consent in writing to the waiver of such prohibition." and an and the second state Section 10. Section 25308 of the Government Code of Guam

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is hereby amended to read as follows: 19 "Section 25308. Minors: employment forbidden. A 20 licensee shall not employ any minor under the age of 21 22 eighteen (18), in or about that portion of the premises which is used for the sale or service of alcoholic 23 beverages for consumption on the premises. Provided, 24 however, that minors ages sixteen (16) and above may 25 be employed as entertainers in on-sale premises under 26 regulations made by the Board. Such regulations shall 27 28 include but are not limited to,, provisions for registration of entertainers, hours of employment, conditions 29 of employment, and the responsibility of licensees 30 employing such minors." 31

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Section 11. Section 25308.1 of the Government Code of Guam is hereby amended to read as follows:

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"Section 25308.1. Same: entry forbidden. No person under eighteen (18) years of age shall enter an establishment where alcoholic beverages, except beer, are consumed, unless such establishment is a public eating place as defined in Section 25013 of the Government Code of Guam. Every person who violates this section shall be guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by a fine of not more than five hundred dollars (\$500.00), or by imprisonment for a period not exceeding ninety (90) days, or by both such fine and imprisonment."

Section 12. Section 25318 of the Government Code of Guam is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 25318. Same: to minor. A licensee, his agent or employee shall not sell, give nor permit to be sold, given or served any alcoholic beverages to any person under eighteen (18) years of age. For the purpose of preventing any violation of this section, any licensee or his agent or employee may refuse to sell or serve alcoholic beverages to any person who is unable to produce adequate written evidence that he or she is over the age of eighteen (18) years. In any criminal prosecution or proceeding for the suspension or revocation of any license and based upon a violation of this section, proof that the defendant licensee or his agent or employee demanded and was shown, before furnishing any alcoholic beverage to a minor, an identification card or other bona fide documentary evidence of majority of such

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person shall be a defense to such prosecution or proceeding for the suspension or revocation of any license. Every person who violates this section shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, punishable by a fine of not more than five hundred dollars (\$500.00), or by imprisonment for a period of not exceeding ninety (90) days, or by both such fine and imprisonment." Section 13. Section 25318.1 of the Government Code of Giam is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 25318.1. Same: false identification by minor. Any person, under eighteen (18) years of age, who exhibits a false identification card or false document for the purpose of purchasing or obtaining alcoholic beverages, shall be punished by a fine of not more than five hundred dollars (\$500.00), or by imprisonment not exceeding six (6) months, or by both such fine and imprisonment."

Section 14. Section 25519 of the Government Code of Guam is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 25519. Same: minors. Any person under the age of eighteen (18) years purchasing alcoholic beverages or in possession thereof shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not more than one hundred dollars (\$100.00) or by imprisonment not exceeding three (3) months, or by both such fine and imprisonment."

27 Section 15. Repealer. With the exception of Sections 8967 28 and 8927 of the Government Code of Guam all other sections of 29 the Codes of Guam, all other laws, and all rules or regulations 30 to the contrary are hereby amended to reflect the change of the 31 age of majority to 18 years of age.
