





AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 4003 OF THE
GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM TO PROHIBIT
THE ADDITION OF PREFERENTIAL CREDIT
TO CIVIL SERVICE EXAMINATION SCORES
UNLESS A MINIMUM PASSING GRADE IS
OBTAINED.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Section 4003 of the Government Code of Guam
3 is hereby amended to read as follows:

4 "Section 4003. Preference. No preference shall be
5 given in the government service, except that residents
6 of Guam who are veterans of the Armed Forces of the
7 United States, or members of the Guam Police Combat Patrol,
8 as certified by the Director of Public Safety, shall
9 receive a preferential credit of five (5) points which
10 shall be added to their competitive examination score
11 for purposes of initial employment or promotion, and such
12 veterans or former members who are disabled as a result of
13 their service in the Armed Forces or the Combat Patrol,
14 shall receive a preferential credit of ten (10) points
15 which shall be added to their competitive examination score
16 for purposes of initial employment or promotion; provided,
17 however, that preferential credit shall not be added to
18 competitive examination scores for purposes of promotion,
19 unless a minimum passing grade is obtained without the
20 credit. In addition, if two applicants for government
21 service are equally qualified for the position to be
22 filled, and one is a resident veteran or member of the
23 Guam Police Combat Patrol, while the other applicant is
24 not, the applicant veteran or Combat Patrol member shall
25 be given preference."
