AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 4003 OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM TO PROHIBIT THE ADDITION OF PREFERENTIAL CREDIT TO CIVIL SERVICE EXAMINATION SCORES UNLESS A MINIMUM PASSING GRADE IS OBTAINED.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM: Section 1. Section 4003 of the Government Code of Guam is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 4003. Preference. No preference shall be given in the government service, except that residents of Guam who are veterans of the Armed Forces of the United States, or members of the Guam Police Combat Patrol, as certified by the Director of Public Safety, shall receive a preferential credit of five (5) points which shall be added to their competitive examination score for purposes of initial employment or promotion, and such veterans or former members who are disabled as a result of their service in the Armed Forces or the Combat Patrol, shall receive a preferential credit of ten (10) points which shall be added to their competitive examination score for purposes of initial employment or promotion; provided, however, that preferential credit shall not be added to competitive examination scores for purposes of promotion, unless a minimum passing grade is obtained without the credit. In addition, if two applicants for government service are equally qualified for the position to be filled, and one is a resident veteran or member of the Guam Police Combat Patrol, while the other applicant is not, the applicant veteran or Combat Patrol member shall be given preference."
