AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 23128 AND SUB-PARAGRAPH (b) OF SECTION 23105 OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM AND TO ADD SUBPARAGRAPH (c) TO SECTION 23105 OF SAID CODE TO REQUIRE POLICE VEHICLES TO HAVE BLUE REVOLVING OR FLASHING LIGHTS.

WHEREAS, the Department of Public Safety is presently equipping automobiles used by it as marked police cars with red revolving dome lights; and

WHEREAS, motorists and other persons, because of the prevalent use of red lights and the resulting confusion from their widespread use, frequently do not respond to the flashing red lights of police cars; now therefore

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. Section 23128 of the Government Code of Guam is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 23128. Conduct of operators and pedestrians on approach of authorized emergency vehicles. Upon the immediate approach of an authorized emergency vehicle sounding a siren or having at least one lighted lamp exhibiting red or blue light visible under normal atmospheric conditions from a distance of 500 feet to the front of such vehicles:

(1) The operators of all other vehicles shall yield the right of way and shall immediately drive to a position parallel to, and as close as possible, to the right-hand edge or curb of the highway clear of any intersection and thereupon stop and remain in such position until such authorized emergency vehicle has passed, except when otherwise directed by a police officer or such other officer invested by law to direct and regulate traffic under the provisions of this Code.

(2) All pedestrians upon the highway shall remain in a place of safety or proceed to the nearest curb or place of safety until such authorized emergency vehicle has passed, except when otherwise directed by a police officer or such other officer invested by law to direct and regulate traffic under the provisions of this Code."

Section 2. Subparagraph (b) of Section 23105 of the Government Code of Guam is hereby amended to read as follows:

"(b) No person shall operate or move any vehicle upon the public highways bearing or displaying a lighted red or blue lamp or light, other than a rear lamp as described in this Chapter, urless such vehicle be an ambulance, a vehicle attached to the Department of Public Safety, or to a military law enforcing agency or such vehicles authorized to carry such red or blue lamp by the Director of Public Safety."

Section 3. Subparagraph (c) is hereby added to Section 23105 of the Government Code of Guam to read as follows:

"(c) All automobiles or motorcycles used or authorized to be used by the Department of Public Safety as police vehicles shall be equipped with blue revolving or flashing lights."

Section 4. The provisions of this Act shall take effect 120 days after the effective date of this Act.
