





AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 123 OF THE CODE
OF CIVIL PROCEDURE OF GUAM TO ELIMINATE
THE TIME REQUIREMENTS FOR REPORTING COURT
RULES OF PROCEDURE TO THE LEGISLATURE.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Section 123 of the Code of Civil Procedure
3 of Guam is hereby amended to read as follows:

4 "Section 123. Rules of procedure. The Judicial
5 Council shall have the power to prescribe by general
6 rules, the forms of process, writs, pleadings and
7 motions, and the practice and procedure of the courts
8 of Guam in both civil and criminal actions, and appeals
9 therein, and the practice and procedure in proceedings
10 for the judicial review or enforcement of orders of
11 administrative agencies, boards, commissions, and
12 officers.

13 Such rules shall not abridge, enlarge, or modify
14 any substantive right and shall preserve the right of
15 trial by jury as at common law and as declared by the
16 Sixth and Seventh Amendments to the Constitution.

17 Such rules shall not take effect until they have
18 been reported to the Legislature by the Chairman of
19 the Judicial Council, and until the expiration of
20 ninety (90) days after they have been thus reported.

21 All laws in conflict with such rules shall be
22 of no further force or effect after such rules have taken
23 effect. Any such rules heretofore prescribed by the
24 Judicial Council shall remain in effect but shall be
25 reported to the Legislature by January 15, 1969.

26 Any rule may be annulled or amended by a law
27 limited to the purpose."
