by an increasing shortage of adequately trained local
nurses, and that the government has thus failed in
its efforts to induce adequate numbers of local students
to seek a career in nursing.

Section 11886. Stipends. There are hereby established the following stipends for nursing students at the University of Guam:

Unmarried trainees shall receive a monthly allowance in the amount of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) during the first year, One Hundred Twenty-Five Dollars (\$125.00) during the second year, and Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) during the third and fourth years of the program. Married trainees shall receive a monthly allowance of One Hundred Twenty-Five Dollard (\$125.00) during the first year, One Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$150.00) during the second year, and Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00) during the third and fourth years of the program. Registration, tuition and other fees normally assessed shall not be charged, and a credit allowance in an amount not to exceed Seventy-Five Dollars (\$75.00) shall be allowed for each six (6) months to cover the costs of textbooks and supplies. Stipends will be paid only so long as the trainee maintains passing grades at the University.

Section 11887. Selection of trainees. The program shall be open to any student who has completed high school or is otherwise declared by the University

of Guam as eligible for admission to the program and who is a United States citizen and who has been a resident of Guam for at least one year prior to the beginning of the academic semester or term the student is admitted, registered and enrolled in the program. The number of trainees who may enroll in the program annually shall be limited only by the capacity of the University of Guam and by funds made available to it by annual appropriation. In the event of limited space and/or funds, priority shall be given to students at the highest level of training and closest to the completion of their program. No student may receive stipends beyond the number of calendar years normally required to complete a training program.

Section 11888. Employment of trainees: reimbursement. (a) As a condition of selection and enrollment in the program, each trains shall agree to accept employment as a nurse, either professional or practical, in the public health system of Guam including Guam Memorial Hospital, and to continue in such employment for a period of time equal to the period of training under the program.

(b) He shall further agree that, in the event of his failure or refusal to fulfill the obligation set forth in (a), he shall then repay the government of Guam an amount equal to the total monthly allowances paid to him pursuant to Section 11886 including actual cost to the government of textbooks and supplies.

Section 11889. In-service training for resident nurses. Any non-contract professional or practical nurse employed by the government of Guam in a

permanent position who is a U. S. citizen and a bona fide resident of the territory of Guam, who lacks not more than two (2) years or their equivalent in requirements for a degree in nursing shall be entitled to enroll at the University of Guam for the purpose of completing work toward such degree, as an in-service training program whereby he continues to receive his regular salary from the government of Guam, including all scheduled pay increases, so long as he maintains passing work at the University and so long as the program leading to the issuance of the degree in nursing is pursued, provided, however, that no person shall participate in such in-service program in excess of two (2) years or their equivalent. In addition, every person who participates in such program shall be obligated to work for the government of Guam for a period of two (2) years for each year of training received, failing which he shall be liable to repay the cost of his training to the government."
