






Bill No. 951

Introduced by F. R. Santos

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 11814 OF THE
GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM AND TO ADD A
SUBCHAPTER (G) TO CHAPTER IX OF TITLE
XII OF SAID CODE TO INCREASE THE NUMBER
OF PROFESSIONAL AND TECHNICAL SCHOLAR-
SHIPS AND TO PROVIDE FOR FELLOWSHIPS IN
PUPIL PERSONNEL SERVICES.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Section 11814 of the Government Code of Guam
3 is hereby amended to read as follows:

4 "Section 11814. Students entitled to awards. There
5 are hereby established twenty (20) professional and
6 technical annual awards for undergraduate and graduate
7 studies. The awards provided in this subchapter are
8 subject to the following limitations:

9 (a) The applicant must be a bona fide resident of
10 Guam and a United States citizen.

11 (b) The applicant must agree that after
12 completion or termination of his course of studies for
13 which the award was granted, he will return to work
14 on Guam for a period of one (1) year.

15 (c) The applicant must present to the Board
16 prior to the granting of the award satisfactory proof that
17 he has been admitted to the college or university as a
18 full-time student to pursue a program of study in the
19 area of the award applied for.

20 (d) The colleges or universities must be properly
21 accredited and must be approved by the Board.

1 (e) The Board shall select the recipients of the
2 awards upon the basis of scholastic ability, aptitude,
3 and health, as well as the likelihood of the recipient
4 returning to Guam to fill its professional needs.

5 (f) No award shall be made under this subchapter
6 unless the Board has made a written finding that the
7 proposed award shall be for professional or technical
8 skill needed in the territory of Guam."

9 Section 2. Subchapter G is hereby added to Chapter IX of
10 Title XII of the Government Code of Guam to read as follows:

11 "Subchapter G

12 Government of Guam Fellowships in

13 Pupil Personnel Services

14 Section 11824. University of Guam Fellowship
15 in Pupil Personnel Services. The Legislature finds
16 that the critical shortage of trained persons in
17 counseling, guidance and school administration has
18 proved to be a severe handicap to the schools and
19 community of Guam. In order to encourage local
20 residents to develop these skills, there are
21 established ten (10) annual fellowships for persons
22 hereinafter called 'fellows' who are United States
23 citizens and bona fide residents of the territory
24 of Guam and either qualify for acceptance as
25 candidates for the Master of Arts degree in Counselor
26 Education or in Educational Administration at the
27 University of Guam, or possess a baccalaureate degree
28 and are currently enrolled in courses specified by
29 the Board as prerequisite to the Counselor Education
30 or Educational Administration degree programs.
31 The Board is authorized to award such fellowships to
