AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 11814 OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM AND TO ADD A SUBCHAPTER (G) TO CHAPTER IX OF TITLE XII OF SAID CODE TO INCREASE THE NUMBER OF PROFESSIONAL AND TECHNICAL SCHOLAR-SHIPS AND TO PROVIDE FOR FELLOWSHIPS IN PUPIL PERSONNEL SERVICES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM: Section 1. Section 11814 of the Government Code of Guam is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 11814. Students entitled to awards. There are hereby established twenty (20) professional and technical annual awards for undergraduate and graduate studies. The awards provided in this subchapter are subject to the following limitations:

(a) The applicant must be a bona fide resident ofGuam and a United States citizen.

(b) The applicant must agree that after completion or termination of his course of studies for which the award was granted, he will return to work on Guam for a period of one (1) year.

(c) The applicant must present to the Board prior to the granting of the award satisfactory proof that he has been admitted to the college or university as a full-time student to pursue a program of study in the area of the award applied for.

(d) The colleges or universities must be properly accredited and must be approved by the Board.

(e) The Board shall select the recipients of the awards upon the basis of scholastic ability, aptitude, and health, as well as the likelihood of the recipient returning to Guam to fill its professional needs.

(f) No award shall be made under this subchapter unless the Board has made a written finding that the proposed award shall be for professional or technical skill needed in the territory of Guam."

Section 2. Subchapter G is hereby added to Chapter IX of Title XII of the Government Code of Guam to read as follows:

"Subchapter G

Government of Guam Fellowships in Pupil Personnel Services

Section 11824. University of Guam Fellowship in Pupil Personnel Services. The Legislature finds that the critical shortage of trained persons in counseling, guidance and school administration has proved to be a severe handicap to the schools and community of Guam. In order to encourage local residents to develop these skills, there are established ten (10) annual fellowships for persons hereinafter called 'fellows' who are United States citizens and bona fide residents of the territory of Guam and either qualify for acceptance as candidates for the Master of Arts degree in Counselor Education or in Educational Administration at the University of Guam, or possess a baccalaureate degree and are currently enrolled in courses specified by the Board as prerequisite to the Counselor Education or Educational Administration degree programs.
