AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 15004 AND 15005 OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM TO REQUIRE THE CHIEF COMMISSIONER AND COMMISSIONERS AND ASSISTANT COMMISSIONERS TO BE REGISTERED VOTERS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. Section 15004 of the Government Code of Guam is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 15004. Same: qualifications. The Chief Commissioner of Guam shall be a registered voter on Guam, a citizen of the United States, and a permanent resident of Guam for at least five (5) years immediately preceding his appointment, and shall have attained the age of thirty (30) years, and shall have not been convicted of a felony or any crime involving moral turpitude."

Section 2. Section 15005 of the Government Code of Guam

Section 2. Section 15005 of the Government Code of Guam is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 15005. Commissioners and Assistant
Commissioners: qualifications. The Commissioners and
Assistant Commissioners of Guam shall be registered voters
on Guam, citizens of the United States who have attained the
age of twenty-one (21) years and met the other qualifications prescribed by Section 15004 for the Chief
Commissioner. Commissioners and Assistant Commissioners
must have resided within the municipality or area which
they are to represent for a period of thirty (30) days,
immediately preceding the date of any special or general
election at which they are candidates for election, and
shall continue to reside therein throughout their term of
office."
