CERTIFICATION OF PASSAGE OF AN ACT TO THE GOVERNOR



Introduced by J. B. Butler

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 15004 AND 15005
OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM TO REQUIRE
THE CHIEF COMMISSIONER AND COMMISSIONERS
AND ASSISTANT COMMISSIONERS TO BE REGIS-
TERED VOTERS.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Section 15004 of the Government Code of Guam
3 is hereby amended to read as follows:

4 "Section 15004. Same: qualifications. The Chief
5 Commissioner of Guam shall be a registered voter on Guam,
6 a citizen of the United States, and a permanent resident
7 of Guam for at least five (5) years immediately preceding
8 his appointment, and shall have attained the age of
9 thirty (30) years, and shall have not been convicted of
10 a felony or any crime involving moral turpitude."

11 Section 2. Section 15005 of the Government Code of Guam
12 is hereby amended to read as follows:

13 "Section 15005. Commissioners and Assistant
14 Commissioners: qualifications. The Commissioners and
15 Assistant Commissioners of Guam shall be registered voters
16 on Guam, citizens of the United States who have attained the
17 age of twenty-one (21) years and met the other qualifi-
18 cations prescribed by Section 15004 for the Chief
19 Commissioner. Commissioners and Assistant Commissioners
20 must have resided within the municipality or area which
21 they are to represent for a period of thirty (30) days,
22 immediately preceding the date of any special or general
23 election at which they are candidates for election, and
24 shall continue to reside therein throughout their term of
25 office."
