AN ACT TO ADD A SECTION 9670.13 TO THE GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM TO PROVIDE SEWER CONNECTIONS TO UNDERPRIVILEGED RESIDENTS OF THE TERRITORY WITHOUT CHARGE AND TO AMEND SECTIONS 31100, 33401, 36100 AND 36200 OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM RELATIVE TO THE BUILDING CODE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM: Section 1. A Section 9670.13 is hereby added to the Government Code of Guam to read as follows:

"Section 9670.13. Sewer connection for underprivileged. The Chief Officer of the Public Utility Agency of Guam shall connect or cause to be connected without charge the island-wide sewer system to the residences of all persons or families certified by the Department of Public Health and Social Services to be 'underprivileged' within the guidelines established by the Director of Public Health and Social Services."

Section 2. Subparagraphs (y) and (z) of Section 31100 of the Government Code of Guam are hereby amended to read as follows:

"(v) Uniform Building Code is the current edition 1 (Volume 1) of the Uniform Building Code, published by the 2 International Conference of Building Officials. 3 (z) U.B.C. Standards is the current edition of the L 5 Uniform Building Code Standards, published by the International Conference of Building Officials." 5 Section 3. Section 33401 of the Government Code of Guam 7 is hereby amended to read as follows: 8 "Section 33401. Same: stud walls. Exterior stud 9 10 walls and bearing stud walls shall consist of not less than two inch by four inch (2" x 4") nominal studs spaced 11 at not to exceed twenty-four (24) inches. The height of two 12 inch by four inch (2" x 4") studs shall not exceed twelve 13 14 (12) feet. The height of two inch by six inch or three inch by four inch (2" x 6" or 3" x 4") studs shall not 15 exceed sixteen (16) feet. Studs shall be doubled at the 16 sides of openings." 17 Section 4. Section 36100 of the Government Code of Guam 13 19 is hereby amended to read as follows: "Section 36100. Electric installations. The current 20 27

edition of the National Electrical Code of the National Fire Protection Association, 60 Battermarch Street, Boston, Massachusetts, shall be accepted as the generally recognized standard for the design and construction of electrical installations."

Section 5. Section 36200 of the Government Code of Guam is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 36200. Plumbing installations. The current edition of the Uniform Plumbing Code of the International Association of Plumbing and Mechanical Officials, 5032 Alhambra Avenue, Los Angeles, California, shall be accepted as the generally recognized standard for the design and construction of plumbing installations."
