AN ACT TO AMEND SUBPARAGRAPH (j) OF SECTION 23100 OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM TO PROVIDE THAT DRIVERS LICENSES SHALL CONTAIN PHOTOGRAPHS OF THE LICENSEE AND BE LAMINATED IN PLASTIC.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. Subparagraph (j) of Section 23100 of the

Government Code of Guam is hereby amended to read as follows:

"(j) Every license and permit shall state whether it is an operator's or chauffeur's license or instruction permit and shall bear thereon the distinguishing number assigned to the applicant, the date of expiration, the name, the age and residence address of the licensee, a brief description of such licensee for the purpose of identification, his photograph in color or black and white, and space for the signature of the licensee. In the case of a chauffeur's license, the license shall also state whether it is a general or restricted license, and if restricted, the type of vehicle or combination of vehicles the licensee is licensed to operate. Each license and permit shall also contain a space for the endorsement thereon of a record of each suspension or revocation thereof. Upon receipt of a license or permit the licensee or permittee shall write his usual signature with pen and ink in the space provided on the license or permit and such license or permit shall not be valid until so signed. After signature the license shall be laminated in plastic by the Department and returned to the licensee."
