AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 6610:4 OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM TO INCREASE THE PER DIEM TRAVEL ALLOWANCE OF THE GOVERNMENT OF GUAM EMPLOYEES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM: Section 1. Section 6610.4 of the Government Code of

Guam is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 6610.4. Per diem allowance. Any employee and his dependents, including a spouse as authorized by item (c) of Section 6610.3, while traveling on official business and away from the designated post of duty of such employees, shall be allowed, in lieu of their actual expenses or subsistence, a per diem allowance in an amount prescribed according to regulations, but not to exceed Thirty-Five Dollars (\$35.00) except that the Governor, the Lieutenant Governor, the judges of the Island Court, and members of the Legislature shall be allowed Sixty Dollars (\$60.00), and the directors and executive heads of the various departments and agencies of the government of Guam, and such other officials as the Governor shall authorize shall be allowed Forty-Five Dollars (\$45.00). Guam's Washington Representative shall also be allowed a per diem allowance of Sixty Dollars (\$60.00) while traveling on official business and away from Washington, D. C., except when he is in Guam."
