

Introduced by F. R. Santos

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 6610.4 OF THE
GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM TO INCREASE
THE PER DIEM TRAVEL ALLOWANCE OF THE
GOVERNMENT OF GUAM EMPLOYEES.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Section 6610.4 of the Government Code of
3 Guam is hereby amended to read as follows:

4 "Section 6610.4. Per diem allowance. Any employee
5 and his dependents, including a spouse as authorized
6 by item (c) of Section 6610.3, while traveling on official
7 business and away from the designated post of duty of
8 such employees, shall be allowed, in lieu of their actual
9 expenses or subsistence, a per diem allowance in an
10 amount prescribed according to regulations, but not to
11 exceed Thirty-Five Dollars (\$35.00) except that the
12 Governor, the Lieutenant Governor, the judges of the
13 Island Court, and members of the Legislature shall be
14 allowed Sixty Dollars (\$60.00), and the directors and
15 executive heads of the various departments and agencies
16 of the government of Guam, and such other officials as the
17 Governor shall authorize shall be allowed Forty-Five
18 Dollars (\$45.00). Guam's Washington Representative shall
19 also be allowed a per diem allowance of Sixty Dollars
20 (\$60.00) while traveling on official business and away from
21 Washington, D. C., except when he is in Guam."
