Introduced by L. S. N. Paulino T. C. Charfauros

AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION TO IMPLEMENT THE INTENT OF PUBLIC LAW 11-146, ELEVENTH GUAM LEGISLATURE, RELATIVE TO THE PAYMENT OF BONUSES TO VETERANS OF THE ARMED FORCES OF THE UNITED STATES WHO SERVED IN ACTIVE DUTY DURING THE WORLD WAR II. KOREAN WAR OR THE INDO-CHINA CONFLICT, AND TO AMEND SECTION 2103 OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM RELATIVE TO COMPENSATION FOR MEMBERS OF THE PRECINCT BOARD.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM: Section 1. There is hereby appropriated from any available funds in the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund the sum of One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000) to implement the intent of Public Law 11-146, Eleventh Guam Legislature, for payment of bonuses to persons entitled as prescribed by Section 8981 of the Government Code of Guam.

Section 2. Section 2103 of the Government Code of Guam is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 2103. Same: members and compensation. To each and every polling place designated, the Commission shall appoint a precinct board consisting of an inspector, two judges and two clerks.

The concurrence of two (2) members shall be necessary for any ruling of the precinct board. The two clerks shall have no vote.

All members of the precinct boards shall be paid Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) each for services rendered for each election."

Section 3. Section 2 of this Act shall take effect November 6, 1972.
