## Introduced by

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 2205 AND 15007 OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM RELATIVE TO CANDIDATES FOR ELECTIVE OFFICE. AND VACANCIES IN THE OFFICE OF ASSISTANT COMMISSIONERS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM: Section 1. Section 2205 of the Government Code of Guam is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 2205. (a) No person shall be eligible for more than one office to be filled in the same election, and may not file notice of candidacy for more than one office. The term 'election' as used in this section includes a general and a local election held on the same date so as to prohibit a person running for office in a local election and in a general election at the same time.

(b) No person shall be eligible for an office to be filled in an election if sixty (60) days prior to the primary he is holding another elected office, the term of which will not expire on or prior to the date of commencement of the term of office for which he is running."

Section 2. Section 15007 of the Government Code of Guam is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 15007. Vacancies. (a) A vacancy in the Office of Chief Commissioner shall be filled by appointment by the Governor of Guam by and with the advice and consent of the Guam Legislature, and such

appointee shall serve during the unexpired portions of the term for which his predecessor was appointed or elected.

(b) A vacancy in the Office of Assistant Commissioner shall be filled for the unexpired term at the next general election. Until the time of said general election vacancies shall be filled by appointment by the Governor of Guam by and with the consent of the Legislature, and such appointees shall serve until the next general election.

(c) If, by reason of death, resignation, removal from office, inability, or failure to qualify, there is a vacancy in the office of Commissioner of a municipality or village for which there is an Assistant Commissioner, then the Assistant Commissioner shall, upon his resignation as Assistant Commissioner, act as Commissioner. A vacancy in the office of Commissioner of a municipality or village for which there is no Assistant Commissioner shall be filled for the unexpired term at a special election to be called by the Governor in accordance with the special election provisions set forth in Chapter XIII, Title III, of the Government Code."

Section 3. Nothwithstanding any provisions of the law to the contrary, the vacancies in the Office of Assistant Commissioner of Dededo and the Office of Assistant Commissioner of Agat, existing as of November 7, 1972, shall be filled at a local special election to be called by the Governor in accordance with the special election provisions set forth in Chapter XIII, Title III, of the Government Code. The Assistant Commissioners duly elected shall serve until the second Monday of January, 1977, and their successors shall be elected at the regular general election in 1976.
