AN ACT MAKING APPROPRIATION FROM THE LAND TRANSFER FUND FOR EXPENDITURES - IN EXCESS OF APPROPRIATION, TO MAKE APPRO-PRIATION FROM THE LAND TRANSFER FUND FOR THE SURVEY OF CERTAIN BEACH AREAS AND TO AMEND SECTIONS 13970 AND 13971 OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM TO REQUIRE AN ANNUAL REPORT AND PROGRAM FOR THE SURVEYING OF GOVERNMENT LAND, INCREASING THE LAND SURVEY FUND AND EXTENDING ITS OPERATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. There is hereby appropriated from the Unappropriated Surplus of the Land Survey Fund the sum of Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$30,000) for the expenditures in excess of appropriation made from said Land Survey Fund.

Section 2. There is hereby appropriated from the Unappropriated Surplus of the Land Survey Fund the sum of Fifty-five Thousand Dollars (\$55,000) for the purpose of surveying and registering under the provisions of the Land Title Registration Law, that strip of government land between the mean thigh watermark of the Pacific Ocean and the privately-owned properties along the coastline of Guam. In carrying out this Act, first priority shall be given to the survey and registration of such strip of land along Agana Bay, second priority of such strip of land along Tumon Bay, and the third priority to such strip of land in the village of Asan, and Agat.

Section 3. Section 13970 of the Government Code of Guam is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 13970. Survey of government land: duty of Territorial Surveyor. All real property belonging to the

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government of Guam for which certificates of title
have not been issued, shall be surveyed and mapped in
order to accomplish the registration of such property.
The Territorial Surveyor shall carry out a program, on a
continuing basis, to so survey and register governmentowned land, and such program shall include, but not
necessarily be limited to the following:

- (1) Completing the calculation and field traverse necessary to establish the Guam Geodetic Triangulation Net, including the referencing of all markers, the integration of such system with those previously established on Guam, and the restoration of all monuments destroyed since the initiation of said system;
- (2) Researching all existing survey records and plans, selecting those surveys that can be utilized, updating such survey by connecting them to the Guam Geodetic Triangulation Net, verifying questionable boundaries, and completing registration proceedings for those lots for which surveys already exist;
- (3) Selecting from the remaining parcels of government land those parcels of highest land value and proceeding to survey them in order of value, on a parcel basis, until all government of Guam land is surveyed;
- (4) Putting all parcels of government of Guam land on the cadastral maps of the government;
- (5) Submitting to the Legislature, prior to any appropriations, a systematic program of planned surveys for the following year, showing the estimated amounts of funds needed for each such separate survey, and the estimated time of completion.

There is hereby authorized to be appropriated the sum of not to exceed Nine Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$900,000)

to carry out the purposes of this Act."

Section 4. Section 13971 of the Government Code of Guam is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 13971. Creation of Land Survey Fund. There is within the government of Guam a special fund known as the 'Land Survey Fund'. The Land Transfer Fund is abolished and all moneys therein, except those moneys derived from the program of clearing the fractional lots in the City of Agana, are transferred to the Land Survey Fund. The Land Survey Fund shall be under the administration of the Director of Land Management, but no moneys shall be expended therefrom except by appropriation of the Legislature, provided, however, that the Legislature shall not make any appropriation under this section until the Director of Land Management has submitted to the Legislature the systematic program of planned surveys required by Subparagraph (5) of Section 13970 of this Chapter. All proceeds from the sale and lease of public lands, from land permit fees, and all other income derived from the operation of the Department of Land Management, including recording fees, but excluding the Document Tax proceeds, shall be covered into the Land Survey Fund; provided, however, that the maximum amount of said fund shall not exceed Nine Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$900,000) all such income in excess of said amount to be covered into the General Fund. The Land Survey Fund shall cease and terminate on June 30, 1978, and moneys in said fund at such time shall be covered into the General Fund."

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
