AN ACT TO AMEND SUBSECTION (b) OF SECTION 27000 OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM, TO ADD A NEW SUBSECTION (d) TO SECTION 27130 OF SAID CODE, AND TO ADD A CHAPTER V TO TITLE XXVIII OF SAID CODE TO AUTHORIZE THE PRACTICE OF ACUPUNCTURE IN GUAM AND TO ESTABLISH A COMMITTEE TO REGULATE LICENSING OF ACUPUNCTURE PRACTITIONERS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM: Section 1. Subsection (b) of Section 27000 of the Government Code of Guam is hereby amended to read as follows:

"(b) 'The Healing Art' means the art of detecting or attempting to detect the presence of any disease; of determining or attempting to determine the nature and state of any disease, if present; or preventing, relieving, correcting or curing of or attempting to prevent, relieve, correct or cure any disease; of safeguarding or attempting to safeguard the life of any woman or infant through pregnancy and parturition; and of doing or attempting to do any of the acts enumerated above: Provided, that for the purpose of this Title the term 'Healing Art' does not include (1) podiatry, nor (2) pharmacy, nor (3) nursing, nor (4) optometry as defined in Section 27130 (c) of this Title, nor (5) healing by prayer under the conditions set forth in Section 27127 of this .Title nor (6) acupuncture as defined in Section 27130(d) of this Title." Section 2. A new Subsection (d) is hereby added to Section 27130 of the Government Code of Guam to read as follows:

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"(d) 'Acupuncture' in the meaning of this Chapter 1 is defined as a therapy developed by the ancient Chinese 2 that consist of stimulation of designated points on the 3 skin by insertion of needles, application of heat, 4 massage, or a combination of these." 5 Section 3. A new Chapter V is hereby added to Title 6 7 XXVIII, Medical Practices, of the Government Code of Guam to be designated as 'Acupuncture Practitioners'. The full text 3 g of such Chapter shall read as follows: "CHAPTER V 10 Acupuncture Practitioners 11 Section 27400. Practice of acupuncture defined. For 12 13 the purposes of this Chapter the practice of acupuncture is defined in Section 27130(d) of the Government Code 14 15 of Guam. Section 27401. License required. Except as otherwise 16 17 provided by law, no person shall practice acupuncture 18 in the territory either gratuitously or for pay, or shall 19 offer to so practice, or shall advertise or announce 20 himself, either publicly or privately, as prepared or 21 qualified to so practice, without having a valid license 22 obtained from the board of examiners for the practice 23 of acupuncture. Section 27402. Qualifications for examination. No 24 person shall be licensed to practice acupuncture unless 25 26 he has passed an examination and has been found to be 27 possessed of the necessary qualifications as prescribed 28 in the rules and regulations promulgated by the board 29 of examiners for acupuncture in accordance with Section 30 27403 below. Before any applicant shall be eligible for such 31

examinations he shall furnish satisfactory proof to the

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board that: 1 2 (1) He (a) is a citizen of the United States; or (b) if not a citizen of the United States, has 3 4 declared his intention to become a citizen of the United States, as provided by law; 5 (2) He is a resident of the territory; 6 7 (3) He is of good moral character; and 8 (4) He satisfies any other requirements the 9 board of examiners for the practice of acupuncture 10 may deem necessary and pertinent to the practice of 11 acupuncture. 12 Section 27403. Board of examiners for the practice of 13 acupuncture; appointment, removal, qualifications. There 14 shall be a board of examiners for the practice of acupuncture who shall be appointed by the Governor, 15 15 subject to confirmation by the Legislature, in accordance with Section 27104, of the Government Code of Guam, 17 18 whose duty it shall be to examine all applicants for 19 license to practice acupuncture. 20 The board shall consist of five (5) persons: one (1) 21 shall be a physician or surgeon licensed under the laws of 22 the territory, one (1) shall be a licensed practitioner of 23 acupuncture, one (1) shall be a member of the legal pro-24 fession, one (1) shall be the Director of Public Health and 25 Social Services, and one (1) an individual who is not a 26 licensed physician, practitioner of acupuncture, or attor-27 ney but who is a resident, in good standing, of the terri-28 tory of Guam. However, the initial board of examiners shall consist of three (3) members: one (1) shall be a member of 29 the legal profession, one (1) the Director of Public Health 30 31 and Social Services, and one (1) a resident, in good standing, of the territory of Guam. The members of the board shall 32 serve without pay but shall be reimbursed for actual 33

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expenses incurred in the discharge of their duties. A 1 majority of the board shall constitute a quorum. 2 Section 27404. Powers and duties of the board. The 3 board of examiners for the practice of acupuncture shall: 4 5 (1) Adopt rules and regulations in accordance 6 with Section 27403 to carry out the purposes of this 7 Chapter; (2) Develop standards for licensure; 8 9 (3) Prepare and administer examinations; 10 (4) Issue, renew, suspend, and revoke licenses; 11 (5) Register applicants or holders of a license, 12 permanent or temporary; (6) Investigate and conduct hearings regarding 13 violations of this Chapter and any rules and 14 15 regulations of the board; (7) Maintain a record of its proceedings; and 16 17 (8) Do all things necessary to carry out the functions, powers, and duties set forth in the Chapter. 13 Section 27405. Examination; fees. No applicant shall 19 be examined under this Chapter until he has paid to the 20 21 board of examiners for the practice of acupuncture a fee of Twenty-Five Dollars (\$25.00). Every person 22 holding a license under this Chapter shall re-register 23 24 with the board each year, not later than January 31, 25 and for such registration shall pay a fee of Twenty-Five Dollars (\$25.00). Failure to do so shall constitute 26 a forfeiture of license, which may be restored only 27 23 upon written application therefor and payment to the 29 board of a fee of Fifty Dollars (\$50.00). All such fees shall be deposited to the Treasurer of Guam. 30 Section 27406. Revocation or suspension of licenses. 31 32 Any license to practice acupuncture issued under this

4	of the following acts or omissions on the part of the

б	(1) Obtaining a fee on the assurance that a

9	(2) Making any untruthful and improbable state-
10	ment in advertising one's acupuncture practice or

15	or the imposition or execution of sentence has
16	been suspended, of any felony, or of a misdemeanor

22	(7) Procuring a license through fraud, mis-

-25	or manifest incapacity in the practice of acupuncture.
26	If any license is revoked or suspended by the board
27	for any act or omissions listed in this section, the
28	holder of the license shall be notified in writing by
29	the board of the revocation or suspension. Any license
30	to practice acupuncture may be restored by the board
31	of examiners for the practice or acupuncture as provided
32	in rules and regulations which may be adopted by the board.

Section 27407. Hearings; procedure. Any proceeding before the board of examiners for the practice of acupuncture for the revocation or suspension of a license to practice may be commenced by any person filing a sworn complaint against any applicant for a license to practice acupuncture or licensee with the board charging such applicant or licensee as guilty of any of the acts or omissions specified for the revocation of licenses or unprofessional conduct in Section 27406. The board shall fix a time and place for a hearing upon such charges and shall cause a copy of the same, together with a notice of the time and place fixed for the hearing, to be served upon the accused applicant or licensee, at least fifteen (15) days prior to said date of hearing. When personal service cannot be made and such fact is certified on oath by any person authorized to make such service, the board shall cause to be published a notice of such hearing once in each of three (3) consecutive weeks, the last of which shall be not less than fifteen (15) days prior to the date of such hearing, in a newspaper of general circulation published in the territory. Attendance of witnesses and the production of books, papers, and documents at such hearing may be compelled by subpoena issued by the board which shall be served in accordance with the law applicable to the service of subpoenas upon persons to appear and give testimony in court proceedings. At such hearing the board shall have the power to administer oaths and examine, or cause to be examined, such witnesses as they may require 'for the conduct of the hearing, and it shall not be bound by strict rules of evidence or procedure in the conduct of such hearing, but its determination of the issues before it shall be

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supported by a preponderance of the evidence adduced upon the hearing. At the hearing the accused licensee shall have the right to appear in person or by counsel or both, to produce witnesses and evidence on his or her behalf, to cross-examine witnesses, and to have subpoenas issued by the board. If the accused applicant or licensee is found guilty of any of the charges set, the board may refuse to issue an applicant a license to practice acupuncture and may revoke an existing license.

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Section 27408. Injunction. The practice of acupuncture by any person who has not been issued a license under the provisions of this Chapter or whose license has been suspended or revoked or has expired is hereby declared to be contrary to the law, public policy and to be inimical to the public welfare and to constitute a public nuisance, and may be enjoined pursuant to a request made by the board to the Attorney General of the territory of Guam, to initiate procedures for such injunction. Upon the filing of a petition for injunction against a person violating the provisions of this Chapter, the Court or any judge thereof may issue a temporary injunction against the person or persons charged in the action without notice or bond, enjoining such person or persons from further practicing acupuncture until final hearing on the matter.

Section 27409. Witnesses; subpoenas issued. The board shall have the power to subpoena witnesses, administer oaths to, and examine witnesses on any relevant matter in proceedings before the board. The person whose license is sought in such proceedings to be revoked or suspended shall be entitled to require

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the board to subpoend and to administer oaths to any witness or witnesses who may be able to present evidence relevant in such proceedings, and shall be entitled to examine any such witness and any other witness in such proceedings. The attendance and testimony of witnesses in such proceedings may be compelled by subpoend issued by the Island Court of Guam and said Court is hereby authorized to issue and enforce such subpoends on petition of the board.

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Section 27410. Recalcitrant witnesses; contempt. If any person called before the board as a witness in any proceeding, whether under subpoena or otherwise, except as privileged by law, refuses to answer any question which is relevant to the proceeding and is put to him by the board, a member of the board, or the person whose license is sought to be revoked or suspended in such proceeding, or disobeys any order of the Island Court of Guam, such person shall be cited to appear before the judge to show cause why he should not be punished for contempt of court.

Section 27411. Perjury. Any person who wilfully and knowingly makes under oath any false statement in connection with any such proceeding before the board shall be guilty of perjury and shall be subject to the penalty prescribed by law for perjury. Whenever the board is satisfied that the witness has committed perjury in any proceeding before the board, it shall report the same to the Attorney General, who shall prosecute the witness for perjury.

30 Section 27412. Penalty. Any person who violates the 31 provisions of this Chapter shall be guilty of a petty 32 misdemeanor."
