



CERTIFICATION OF PASSAGE OF AN ACT TO THE GOVERNOR


This is to certify that Bill No. 210, "An Act to amend Section 6500.13 of the Government Code of Guam to increase the limitation of tort liability of the government of Guam to \$35,000 in an action for wrongful death and to \$100,000 in any other tort action", which was heretofore passed and thereafter on April 24, 1973, returned to the Legislature without the approval of the Governor was, in accordance with the Organic Act of Guam, reconsidered by the Legislature and after such reconsideration the Legislature did on the 20th day of June, 1973, agree to pass said bill notwithstanding the objections of the Governor by a vote of two-thirds of all the members thereof, to wit: by a vote of 14 members.

Introduced by F. R. Santos

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 6500.13 OF THE
GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM TO INCREASE
THE LIMITATION OF TORT LIABILITY OF
THE GOVERNMENT OF GUAM TO \$35,000 IN
AN ACTION FOR WRONGFUL DEATH AND TO
\$100,000 IN ANY OTHER TORT ACTION.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Section 6500.13 of the Government Code of
3 Guam is hereby amended to read as follows:

4 "Section 6500.13. Limitation on tort liability.

5 The government of Guam shall not be liable for more
6 than Thirty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$35,000.00) in an
7 action for wrongful death, nor for more than One
8 Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) in any other
9 tort action. The government of Guam shall not be
10 liable for interest prior to the date of judgment,
11 nor for punitive damages."

12 Section 2. Effective date. This Act shall become effective
13 upon approval by the Governor and shall only apply to causes
14 of action which arise on or after the effective date.
