AN ACT TO ESTABLISH AN EXECUTIVE, LEGISLATIVE AND JUDICIAL COMPENSATION COMMISSION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. There is hereby established within the government of Guam an Executive, Legislative and Judicial Compensation Commission which shall review and recommend changes, if necessary, regarding the compensation paid to the Governor, the Lieutenant Governor, the members of the Guam Legislature, the judges of any court established by the Legislature, the municipal commissioners and assistant commissioners.

Section 2. The Executive, Legislative and Judicial Compensation Commission shall consist of nine (9) members, none of whom shall be in the employ of either the Federal government or of the government of Guam. The Governor, the Speaker and the Chief Judge shall each appoint three (3) members to the Commission and notice of appointment and acceptance thereof shall be filed with the Speaker. Any vacancy which may occur shall be filled by the official who made the original appointment or his successor.

Section 3. The members of the Commission shall, by majority vote, elect one of their number to be Chairman.

Section 4. The Director of the Department of Administration shall serve as a non-voting advisor and secretary to the Commission. The Director of Administration is hereby authorized

to use the facilities of his department to assist the Commission in carrying out its duties and responsibilities.

Section 5. The Commission shall meet at least once a month at such time and place as the Chairman may designate. Meetings shall be well publicized and shall be open to members of the public and upon written request members of the public may testify at any meeting of the Commission.

Section 6. The Commission shall have the following general powers and duties:

- (a) The Commission shall review the rates of compensation, expenses and allowances paid the Governor, the Lieutenant Governor, the members of the Legislature, the judges of any court established by the Legislature, the municipal commissioners, and assistant commissioners.
- (b) The Commission, after review and study, shall recommend changes in the rates of pay, if any, by filing a written report with the Speaker of the Legislature specifying the proposed changes to be made, if any, and assigning reasons therefor. If no recommendation is made concerning the compensation paid various public officials the Commission shall file its report and assign its reasons therefor.
- (c) The Commission shall adopt by-laws governing its activities subject to the condition that a majority of the members of the Commission shall be required for the transaction of business.

Section 7. Members of the Commission shall serve without pay but shall be reimbursed for reasonable and necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their duties as certified by the Treasurer of Guam.

Section 8. The Commission shall cause its report to be filed with the Speaker of the Legislature no later than July 1, 1975 and the provisions of this Act shall automatically expire when the Commission submits its report.
