



CERTIFICATION OF PASSAGE OF AN ACT TO THE GOVERNOR





AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 422 OF THE PENAL  
CODE OF GUAM TO LIBERALIZE CURFEW RES-  
TRICTIONS FOR PERSONS UNDER AGE OF  
EIGHTEEN (18).

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Section 422 of the Penal Code of Guam is  
3 hereby amended to read as follows:

4 "Section 422. Curfew hours: persons subject to.  
5 It shall be unlawful for any person under the age of  
6 eighteen (18) years to loiter, idle, wander, stroll, or  
7 play in or upon the public streets, highways, roads,  
8 alleys, parks, playgrounds or other public places or  
9 grounds or buildings, places of amusement and eating  
10 places, vacant lots, or other unsupervised places,  
11 between the hours of ten o'clock p.m. and five o'clock  
12 a.m., of the day immediately following; provided, however,  
13 on Friday and Saturday evenings and on any evening  
14 preceding a holiday the beginning hour of curfew shall  
15 be twelve midnight, and further provided, that, provisions  
16 of this section do not apply to persons in the Armed  
17 Forces of the United States, or married persons, or  
18 when the person is accompanied by his parent, guardian  
19 or other adult person having the care and custody of the  
20 person or other adult person acting as chaperone or when  
21 the person is returning directly home from a meeting,  
22 entertainment, recreational activity, or dance, or when  
23 the person is going home from a meeting, entertainment,  
24 recreational activity or dance, or when the person is

1 going directly to or returning directly from work.

2 A person under eighteen (18) years may obtain food  
3 in a cafe where not otherwise prohibited by law after a  
4 meeting, entertainment, recreational activity, dance or  
5 work after the hour of ten o'clock p.m., but must vacate  
6 the premises immediately after consuming the food served  
7 and proceed directly home. Each violation of the pro-  
8 vision of this section shall constitute a separate  
9 offense."
