




AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 2 OF, TO REPEAL
AND REENACT SECTION 3, AND TO ADD SECTIONS
4 AND 5 TO PUBLIC LAW 10-118, TENTH GUAM
LEGISLATURE, TO WAIVE PAYMENTS OF RETIREMENT
CONTRIBUTIONS OF THOSE FORMER TEMPORARY
GOVERNMENT EMPLOYEES MADE PERMANENT
EMPLOYEES ON JULY 1, 1964.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Section 2 of Public Law 10-118, Tenth Guam
3 Legislature is hereby amended to read as follows:

4 "Section 2. The employment status of those
5 temporary employees of the Public Utility Agency of
6 Guam, and of the Department of Public Works, the
7 latter commonly referred to as the 'Construction
8 Battalion', shall be converted as of the effective
9 date of this Act from 'temporary' to 'permanent';
10 subject to the following conditions:

11 (a) Initial appointment shall be probationary,
12 in accord with the Personnel Rules and Regulations;

1 (b) Such employees shall retain their current
2 class titles, subject to classification study, follow-
3 ing which compensation shall be adjusted to the first
4 step of the pay range of the position determined by
5 such study;

6 (c) For purposes of calculating leave and retire-
7 ment benefits, such employees, including those age
8 sixty or over on July 1, 1964, shall be credited with
9 their temporary service prior to July 1, 1964. The amount
10 of contributions such employees would have made to the Fund
11 had they been permanent employees at the time of their
12 temporary service shall be paid into the Fund by the
13 government of Guam. No such employee may be denied
14 membership in the retirement fund solely because he
15 was over the age of 60 years on July 1, 1964. The
16 amount of contribution to be paid into the fund by the
17 government of Guam shall be determined by applying the
18 applicable percentage rate for both the government and
19 the employees' shares to the total wages paid to such
20 employees."

21 Section 2. Section 3 of Public Law 10-118, Tenth Guam
22 Legislature, is hereby repealed and reenacted to read as
23 follows:

24 "Section 3. Any such employee who is now paying
25 contributions to the Retirement Fund shall cease paying
26 upon the effective date of this Act. Further, all such
27 payments made by such employees as of the effective
28 date of the Act shall be reimbursed in full."

29 Section 3. Sections 4 and 5 are hereby added to Public
30 Law 10-118, Tenth Guam Legislature, to read as follows:

31 "Section 4. There is hereby authorized to be

1 appropriated from any available funds in the
2 Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund the
3 sum of Two Hundred Twenty-Five Thousand Dollars
4 (\$225,000.00) for the purpose of carrying out the
5 intent and purpose of this Act.

6 Section 5. The provisions of this Act shall be
7 retroactive to July 1, 1964."
