AN ACT TO AMEND SUBSECTION (c) OF SECTION 20002 OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM TO PROVIDE THAT THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE GUAM HOUSING CORPORATION SHALL DETERMINE THE INTEREST RATE ON LOANS FOR LOW-COST HOUSING, AND TO INCREASE THE MAXIMUM AMOUNT OF LOW-COST HOUSING LOANS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:
Section 1. Subsection (c) of Section 20002 of the Govern-

ment Code of Guam is hereby amended to read as follows:

"(c) To encourage and engage in low-cost housing activities, including development of residential subdivisions, construction of housing for rental or resale, and to make loans to any person for the purchase, construction, improvement or repair of a home. All loans so made shall-be of such sound value or so secured as reasonably to assure repayment taking into consideration the policy of the Legislature that the lending powers of the Housing Corporation shall be administered as a means for accomplishing the purposes stated in Section 20000 of this Chapter, and shall bear interest at a rate to be determined by the Board of Directors of the Guam Housing Corporation but not exceeding the Federal Housing Administration rate. Loans should be made to the residents of Guam to enable them to purchase or construct permanent homes which are typhocn resistant. All loans hereunder shall not exceed Twenty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000) and to include therein the cost of the building. An additional sum of not to exceed Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000) may be borrowed."

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
