Bill No. 104

Introduced by F. R. Santos

AN ACT TO ADD SUBPARAGRAPH (c) TO SECTION
46005 OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM TO
REQUIRE THAT EMPLOYEES RECEIVE A MEAL
PERIOD FROM THEIR EMPLOYERS.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Subparagraph (c) is hereby added to Section
3 46005 of the Government Code of Guam to read as follows:

4 "(c) No employer shall employ any employee for a
5 work period of more than five (5) hours without a meal
6 period of not less than thirty (30) minutes; except
7 that when a work period of not more than six (6) hours
8 will complete the day's work, the meal period may be
9 waived by mutual consent of employer and employee. Meal
10 period shall not be considered 'on duty' or counted
11 as time worked, unless the nature of his work prevents
12 an employee from being relieved of duty."
