





AN ACT TO ADD SECTION 23113.2 TO THE
GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM TO REQUIRE
CERTAIN MOTOR TRUCKS, TRAILERS, SEMI-
TRAILERS AND OTHER COMMERCIAL VEHICLES
TO BE EQUIPPED WITH FLAPS OR OTHER
PROTECTIVE DEVICES.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Section 23113.2 is hereby added to the
3 Government Code of Guam to read as follows:

4 "Section 23113.2. Fenders and mudguards. No
5 person shall operate any motor vehicle having three
6 or more wheels, any trailer, or semi-trailer unless
7 equipped with fenders, covers, or devices, including
8 flaps or splash aprons, or unless the body of the
9 vehicle or attachments thereto afford adequate
10 protection to effectively minimize the spray or splash
11 of water or mud to the rear of the vehicle and all such
12 equipment or such body or attachments thereto
13 shall be at least as wide as the tire tread. This section
14 does not apply to those vehicles exempt from registration,
15 trailers and semi-trailers having an unladen weight of
16 under 1,500 pounds, or any vehicles manufactured and
17 first registered prior to January 1, 1974, having an
18 unladen weight of under 1,500 pounds."
