

AN ACT REPEALING AND REENACTING SECTION
1 OF PUBLIC LAW 11-87 RELATIVE TO APPRO-
PRIATING FUNDS FOR PILOT PROJECTS FOR THE
CONSTRUCTION OF CIVIC AUDITORIA IN THE
MUNICIPALITIES OF DEDEDO AND TAMUNING.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Section 1 of Public Law 11-87 is hereby repealed
3 and reenacted to read as follows:

4 "Section 1. There is hereby appropriated from any
5 available funds in the Unappropriated Surplus of the
6 General Fund the sum of One Hundred Twenty-Five Thousand
7 Dollars (\$125,000.00) to the Office of the Governor for
8 pilot projects for the construction of youth civic auditoria
9 in the municipalities of Dededo and Tamuning. Such sum
10 to be apportioned as follows:

11 Dededo.....\$62,500
12 Tamuning.....\$62,500"

13 Section 2. Each of the municipal commissioners of the muni-
14 cipalities mentioned foregoing shall have exclusive authority to
15 commit or obligate the appropriation made by this section for
16 the construction of civic auditoria in their respective muni-
17 cipality and for this purpose they shall be considered to be
18 certifying officers.
