CERTIFICATION OF PASSAGE OF AN ACT TO THE GOVERNOR

This is to certify that Bill No. 191, "An Act to add Section 11015 to the Government Code of Guam to rename the Tamuning-Tumon Elementary School the 'Lyndon B. Johnson Elementary School'", which was heretofore passed and thereafter on December 28, 1973, returned to the Legislature without the approval of the Governor was, in accordance with the Organic Act of Guam, reconsidered by the Legislature and after such reconsideration the Legislature did on the 24th day of January, 1974, agree to pass said bill notwithstanding the objections of the Governor by a vote of more than two-thirds of all the members thereof, to wit: by a vote of 15 members.

AN ACT TO ADD SECTION 11015 TO THE
GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM TO RENAME THE
TAMUNING-TUMON ELEMENTARY SCHOOL THE
"LYNDON B. JOHNSON ELEMENTARY SCHOOL".

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Section 11015 is hereby added to the Government
3 Code of Guam to read as follows:

4 "Section 11015. Lyndon B. Johnson Elementary
5 School. The elementary school presently under construc-
6 tion and known as the Tamuning-Tumon Elementary School
7 is hereby renamed the 'Lyndon B. Johnson Elementary
8 School' to honor the late President Lyndon B. Johnson who
9 was responsible for so many programs of such great benefit
10 to the territory of Guam and who was such a great American
11 leader. At such ceremony as the Director deems appropriate,
12 said school shall be so officially named, at which time a
13 plaque bearing the name, picture and a brief history of
14 the contributions of President Johnson to America and to
15 the world shall be affixed at a suitable spot within the
16 school."

17 Section 2. Section 1 of Public Law 12-30, Twelfth Guam
18 Legislature, is hereby amended to read as follows:

19 "Section 1. There is hereby appropriated from
20 any available funds in the Unappropriated Surplus of the
21 General Fund the sum of Thirteen Thousand Two Hundred and
22 Forty-Three Dollars (\$13,243.00) for the purpose of
23 authorizing and directing the Director of the Department
24 of Education to conduct a survey of parents, teachers,

students and other interested groups to determine if there are substantial educational benefits for the children of Guam to be derived from a year-round public school system on Guam and to report its findings to the Speaker of the Legislature no later than December 31, 1973."
