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


CERTIFICATION OF PASSAGE OF AN ACT TO THE GOVERNOR





Introduced by R. F. Taitano

AN ACT TRANSFERRING AND MAKING AN
APPROPRIATION FOR THE HOUSING REVOLVING
FUND AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. The sum of Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000) is
3 hereby transferred from any available funds in the Unappropriated
4 Surplus of the General Fund to the Housing Revolving Fund
5 established by Chapter IV, Title V of the Government Code of
6 Guam.

7 Section 2. The sum of Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000) which
8 is transferred from the General Fund to the Housing Revolving
9 Fund and the anticipated receipts of Eight Hundred Thousand
10 Dollars (\$800,000) of the Housing Revolving Fund for the fiscal
11 year ending June 30, 1974, are hereby appropriated to provide
12 government housing pursuant to the provisions of Chapter IV,
13 Title V, of the Government Code of Guam for the fiscal year
14 ending June 30, 1974 as follows, provided, however, that none
15 of the above mentioned funds shall be expended, obligated, or
16 disbursed to cover any expenditure incurred or obligated on or
17 before June 30, 1973:

18 I. For Personal Services, not to exceed the
19 total of Three Hundred Twenty-Eight Thousand
20 Four Hundred Seventy-Nine Dollars (\$328,479)
21 provided, however, that not more than 44
22 employees shall be on the payroll of the
23 Division of Housing Management at any one
24 time during the fiscal year.

1 II. For local travel, contractual services,
2 supplies and materials, equipment and
3 miscellaneous items \$ 2,488,145

4 Section 3. Section 4301 of the Government Code of Guam is
5 hereby amended to read as follows:

6 "Section 4301. Administration. Government housing
7 shall be made available to employees of the government
8 of Guam and other authorized persons upon such terms
9 and conditions as the Governor shall prescribe by
10 executive order, provided, however, that in no event
11 shall government housing be made available to any
12 person at less than the actual cost paid by the govern-
13 ment for housing it leases or at less than fair market
14 value for housing it owns and provided further that
15 nothing in this section shall have any effect on any
16 contracts relative to subsidized housing for government
17 employees entered into prior to July 1, 1974. The
18 responsibility for administration of government housing
19 shall be delegated to the Director of Administration."

20 Section 4. (a) There is hereby appropriated from any
21 available funds in the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund
22 the sum of Ten Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$10,500) for the
23 operation of Youth Day 1974.

24 (b) All proceeds collected from activities during Youth Day
25 1974 may be expended for the operation of Youth Day 1974.

26 (c) The Central Planning Committee of Youth Day 1974 shall
27 submit to the Guam Legislature and the Governor of Guam a full
28 report of the Youth Day activities including a detailed analysis
29 of all incomes received and expenditures made for the operation
30 of Youth Day 1974, on or before June 1, 1974.
