AN ACT TRANSFERRING AND MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE HOUSING REVOLVING FUND AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. The sum of Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000) is hereby transferred from any available funds in the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund to the Housing Revolving Fund established by Chapter IV, Title V of the Government Code of Guam.

Section 2. The sum of Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000) which is transferred from the General Fund to the Housing Revolving Fund and the anticipated receipts of Eight Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$800,000) of the Housing Revolving Fund for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1974, are hereby appropriated to provide government housing pursuant to the provisions of Chapter IV, Title V, of the Government Code of Guam for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1974 as follows, provided, however, that none of the above mentioned funds shall be expended, obligated, or disbursed to cover any expenditure incurred or obligated on or before June 30, 1973:

I. For Personal Services, not to exceed the total of Three Hundred Twenty-Eight Thousand Four Hundred Seventy-Nine Dollars (\$328,479) provided, however, that not more than 44 employees shall be on the payroll of the Division of Housing Management at any one time during the fiscal year.
