




CERTIFICATION OF PASSAGE OF AN ACT TO THE GOVERNOR

This is to certify that Bill No. 287, "An Act to add a new Chapter XII to Title XXII of the Government Code of Guam to establish the Guam Transit Authority", which was heretofore passed and thereafter on February 27, 1974, returned to the Legislature without the approval of the Governor was, in accordance with the Organic Act of Guam, reconsidered by the Legislature and after such reconsideration the Legislature did on the 15th day of March, 1974, agree to pass said bill notwithstanding the objections of the Governor by a vote of more than two-thirds of all the members thereof, to wit: by a vote of 16 members.



AN ACT TO ADD A NEW CHAPTER XII TO TITLE
XXII OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM TO
ESTABLISH THE GUAM TRANSIT AUTHORITY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. A new Chapter XII is hereby added to Title

XXII of the Government Code of Guam to read as follows:

22 Section 21948. Government of Authority vested in Board.
23 The government of the Authority shall be vested in
24 a Board of Directors.

25 Section 21949. Composition of Board. The Board
26 shall consist of five (5) directors appointed by the
27 Governor with the advice and consent of the Legislature.
28 The Governor will designate, from among the members of the
29 Board thus appointed, the president and vice-president of
30 the Authority. The directors and officers thus appointed
31 and designated shall hold office for terms of three (3)
32 years unless sooner removed by the Governor and shall serve
33 without compensation, except that they may be reimbursed
 for reasonable expenses incurred in carrying out their
 responsibilities.

34 Section 21950. Schedules and fares. The Board of
35 Directors, after public hearing thereon, shall establish
36 schedules and fares to control the operation of the
37 Authority and such schedules and fares may be altered or
38 modified only after public hearing on any proposed changes
39 such as in the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund the sum
40 of \$100,000.

5 such other officers as it deems necessary for the proper

10 contract with responsible transportation companies for the
11 operation of buses and other vehicles owned by the

13 Section 21952. Employees. Employees of the Authority
14 shall be entitled to the same retirement, workmen's
15 compensation and hospital insurance benefits as those to
16 which government of Guam employees are entitled.

17 Subchapter 3. Franchise.

18 Section 21953. Exclusive franchise. The Guam Transit
19 Authority shall have the exclusive franchise for the fur-
20 nishing of public transportation within the territory of
21 Guam and on its roads and highways commencing on July 1,
22 1977. The time from the effective date of this provision
23 to July 1, 1977, shall be deemed an amortization period
24 during which persons presently furnishing public trans-
25 portation for the territory of Guam and upon its roads and
26 highways may continue to do so and thus recover their
27 investment in rolling stock and equipment."

28 Section 2. The sum of Six Hundred Seventy-Five Thousand
29 Dollars (\$675,000) appropriated pursuant to Section 5 of Bill
30 No. 676, as substituted, is hereby reappropriated to the Guam
31 Transit Authority to be used for the purposes set forth in this
32 Act. In the event that Bill No. 676, as substituted, is not
33 enacted into law, there is hereby appropriated from any available
34 funds in the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund the sum

1 of Six Hundred Seventy-Five Thousand Dollars (\$675,000) to be
2 used for the purpose of purchasing transit type buses to be
3 used as set forth in this Act.

4 Section 3. The salary of the General Manager shall not
5 exceed Nineteen Thousand Dollars (\$19,000).
