




CERTIFICATION OF PASSAGE OF AN ACT TO THE GOVERNOR





AN ACT TO REPEAL AND REENACT SECTION 64  
OF THE CIVIL CODE TO AUTHORIZE A WOMAN  
TO ELECT TO RETAIN HER MAIDEN NAME AS  
HER SURNAME UPON MARRIAGE.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Section 64 of the Civil Code is hereby  
3 repealed in its entirety and reenacted as follows:

4 "Section 64. A woman may elect to retain her maiden  
5 name as her surname upon marriage. Upon entering into  
6 a contract of marriage a woman may elect to retain her  
7 maiden name as her surname. Intention of the exercise  
8 of such an election shall be indicated upon the marriage  
9 license application as provided for by Section 69 of the  
10 Civil Code."

11 Section 2. A new Section 64.1 is hereby added to the  
12 Civil Code of Guam to read as follows:

13 "Section 64.1. Upon marriage, the wife is the  
14 sole member of the contracted union or subsequent  
15 family who may elect to use her maiden name as surname."
