






AN ACT MAKING SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATIONS
FOR THE OPERATION OF THE EXECUTIVE AND
JUDICIAL BRANCHES OF THE GOVERNMENT OF
GUAM FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING JUNE 30,
1974 AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. The following sums are hereby appropriated
3 from any available funds in the Unappropriated Surplus of the
4 General Fund to supplement the fiscal year 1974 appropriations
5 made pursuant to Section 20(b) of the Organic Act of Guam
6 for the operations of the departments and agencies of the
7 Executive Branch of the government of Guam for the fiscal
8 year ending June 30, 1974:

1 sum of Two Hundred Twenty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$225,000) in
2 implementation of Public Law 12-82, an Act to amend Section 2
3 of, to repeal and reenact Section 3, and to add Sections 4
4 and 5 to Public Law 10-118, Tenth Guam Legislature, to waive
5 payments of retirement contributions of those former temporary
6 government employees made permanent employees on July 1, 1964.

7 Section 7. The appropriations made by this Act shall
8 include Federal grants-in-aid where applicable.

9 Section 8. Section 81, Chapter III, Title I, Part I of
10 the Code of Civil Procedure is hereby amended to read as follows:

11 "Section 81. Appointment, tenure and salary of judges.
12 The Superior Court shall consist of a presiding judge and
13 such additional judges as may be necessary for the proper
14 dispatch of the business of the court, who shall be
15 appointed by the Legislature, for a term of eight (8)
16 years, unless sooner removed for cause. The Legislature
17 shall appoint each judge from among the three (3) persons
18 who are admitted to the Guam Bar and who have practiced
19 law in Guam for at least six (6) months, who shall be
20 nominated and whose names shall be submitted to the
21 Legislature by the Judicial Council of Guam. The annual
22 salary of the presiding judge shall be Two Thousand Five
23 Hundred Dollars (\$2,500.00) less than an associate justice
24 and the annual salary of the other judges shall be Five
25 Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) less than the presiding judge;
26 provided however that any judge of the Superior Court
27 assigned exclusively to the Traffic Court Division shall
28 receive an annual salary of Three Thousand Dollars
29 (\$3,000.00) less than the other Superior Court judges.

30 In carrying out the provisions of Section 81 of the
31 Code of Civil Procedure, as amended by the preceding
32 section of this Act, the Chief Judge and judges of the
33 Island Court will then assume the office of Presiding

1 Judge and judges of the Superior Court, respectively, and
2 the Judge of the Police Court will be the Judge of the
3 Superior Court, assigned exclusively to the Traffic
4 Court Division of the Superior Court for terms to expire
5 upon the expiration of their present term of office."

6 Section 9. There is hereby authorized to be appropriated
7 from any available funds in the Unappropriated Surplus of the
8 General Fund the sum of Seven Hundred Ninety Thousand Dollars
9 (\$790,000) to the Department of Public Health and Social
10 Services for the purpose of increasing, in light of the recent
11 cost of living increases, payments made by said department to
12 persons who have dependent children; persons who are aged, blind
13 or partially or totally disabled; or persons who for any
14 reason are eligible recipients of public assistance under
15 programs administered by said department.
