



CERTIFICATION OF PASSAGE OF AN ACT TO THE GOVERNOR





AN ACT TO REPEAL AND REENACT SECTION
11202 OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM
TO PRESERVE FREEDOM OF RELIGION.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Section 11202 of the Government Code of Guam
3 is hereby repealed in its entirety and reenacted as follows:

4 "Section 11202. Freedom of religion. The board
5 shall adopt no policy intended to encourage or abridge
6 the freedom of religion guaranteed to the people by the
7 Constitution and the Organic Act. This section shall
8 not be construed to prohibit the keeping within the public
9 schools of the Bible and other sectarian materials for
10 use in teaching history, literature, art and other
11 courses whose content may be related to such materials.
12 This section shall not be construed to deny students from
13 organizing religiously motivated clubs, associations
14 or organizations, provided, however, that such activities
15 are conducted under the same rules and regulations applied
16 to other extracurricular activities."
