AN ACT TO ADD A NEW SECTION 2336 TO CHAPTER VIII OF TITLE III, GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM, RELATIVE TO CAMPAIGN CONTRIBUTIONS BY CORPORATIONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM: Section 1. A new Section 2336 is hereby added to the Government Code of Guam, to read as follows:

"Section 2336. Corporate campaign contributions. (a) It is unlawful for any bank, labor organization or any corporation organized by authority of any law of Guam or any corporation authorized by law to do business on Guam, to make a contribution or expenditure in connection with any election to any political office, or in connection with any primary election or political convention or caucus held to select candidates for any political office, or for any candidate, political committee, or other persons to accept or receive any contribution prohibited by this section.

(b) Every corporation or labor organization which makes any contribution or expenditure in violation of this section shall be fined not more than Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000), and every officer or director of any corporation, or officer of any labor organization, who consents to any contribution or expenditure by the corporation or labor organization, as the case may be, and any person who accepts or receives any contribution, in violation of this section shall be fined not more than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000) or imprisoned not more than one (1) year, or both.

(c) For the purposes of this section, 'labor organization' means any organization of any kind, or any agency or employee representation committee or plan, in which employees participate and which exist for the purpose, in whole or in part, of dealing with employers concerning grievances, labor disputes, wages, rates of pay, hours of employment, or conditions of work."
