AN ACT TO ADD NEW SECTIONS 13979.13, 13979.14, AND 13979.15 TO CHAPTER XIII, TITLE XIV OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM RELATIVE TO REIMBURSEMENT OR COMPENSATION FOR EXPENSES UNDER THE RELOCATION ASSISTANCE ACT OF GUAM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. A new Section 13979.13 is hereby added to Chapter

XIII, Title XIV, Government Code of Guam, to read as follows:

"Section 13979.13. Miscellaneous payments. In addition to other payments authorized by the Relocation Assistance Act, the instrumentality or agency of the government of Guam involved may, as part of the cost of any program or project, reimburse the owner reasonable and necessary expenses incurred for:

- (a) Recording fees, transfer taxes and other expenses incidental to conveying the real property;
- (b) Penalty costs for prepayment of any mortgage then existing entered into in good faith encumbering the real property if the mortgage is on record or has been filed for record as provided by law; and
- (c) The prorata portion of real property taxes paid which are allocable to the period subsequent to the date of vesting title in, or the effective date of possession of such real property by the said instrumentality or agency, whichever is earlier."

Section 2. A new Section 13979.14 is hereby added to Chapter XIII, Title XIV, Government Code of Guam, to read as follows:

"Section 13979.14. Reimbursement for expenses where condemnation does not result in acquisition or is abandoned.

A court having jurisdiction over a proceeding instituted by an instrumentality or agency of the government of Guam to acquire real property by condemnation shall, when required by federal law or by a federal grant contract governing the project or program, award the owner of any right, title or interest in the real property, a sum which will reimburse the owner for his reasonable costs, disbursements and expenses, including reasonable attorney, appraisal and engineering fees actually incurred because of the condemnation proceedings if:

- (a) The final judgment in the proceeding is that the said instrumentality or agency cannot acquire the real property by condemnation; or
- (b) The proceeding is abandoned by the said instrumentality or agency."

Section 3. A new Section 13979.15 is hereby added to Chapter XIII, Title XIV, Government Code of Guam, to read as follows:

"Section 13979.15. Compensation for expenses of inverse condemnation. A court, rendering a judgment for the plaintiff in a proceeding awarding compensation for the actual physical taking of the real property by an instrumentality or agency of the government of Guam, or the instrumentality or agency thereof effecting a settlement of any such proceeding, shall, when required by federal law or by a federal grant contract governing the project or program, determine and award or allow to the plaintiff as a part of the judgment or settlement a sum which will reimburse the plaintiff for his reasonable costs, disbursements and expenses, including reasonable attorney, appraisal and engineering fees actually incurred because of the proceedings."
