AN ACT TO TRANSFER THE FUNCTIONS AND
RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE HEADSTART
DIVISION OF THE COMMUNITY ACTION
AGENCY TO AN APPROPRIATE DIVISION
WITHIN THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Effective November 1, 1974, the functions and
3 responsibilities of the Headstart Division of the Community
4 Action Agency shall be transferred to an appropriate division
5 within the Department of Education and all prior memoranda,
6 Executive Orders and Director's Orders which are in conflict
7 with this Act are hereby superseded and repealed as of November
8 1, 1975.

9 Section 2. The Director of the Department of Education
10 and the Executive Director of the Community Action Agency are
11 hereby directed to co-ordinate their activities to insure that
12 there be a smooth transition and to further insure that the
13 Headstart Program not be disrupted or downgraded in any fashion.
14 In addition, a report shall be filed with the Speaker of the
15 Legislature no later than October 1, 1974, advising the
16 Legislature of progress to date and making recommendations
17 relative to staffing patterns, appropriation requests and
18 any other information which is deemed pertinent to the
19 Legislature.

20 Section 3. In implementing this Act the Director of
21 Education is hereby directed to comply with the rules and regula-
22 tions established by the Office of Child Development, U.S.
23 Department of Health, Education and Welfare as set forth in
24 OCD HS Headstart Policy Manual, as amended. The Director of

1 the Department of Education is further directed to file
2 quarterly reports with the Speaker of the Legislature, said
3 reports to contain information regarding compliance or non-
4 compliance with said rules and regulations and such other
5 information as deemed pertinent by the Director.
