

AN ACT ESTABLISHING THE MERIZO MARINA
FUND, AUTHORIZING AN APPROPRIATION FOR
THE MERIZO MARINA DEVELOPMENT AND
ESTABLISHING CRITERIA THEREOF AND FOR
OTHER PURPOSES.

1 WHEREAS, by the enactment of Public Law 12-127, the
2 people of Guam found that it would be to their distinct
3 benefit if a public marina were constructed at the village
4 of Merizo which would enable them to derive maximum use and
5 benefit from the recreational, economic and natural resource
6 potential which exists in the Cocos Lagoon, Cocos Island and
7 surrounding waters; and

8 WHEREAS, Public Law 12-127 authorized the appropriation
9 of Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000) for the purpose of
10 planning and constructing a Merizo Marina complex which would
11 include boat launching ramps and a public pier; and

12 WHEREAS, it is important that the dedicated efforts
13 of the Merizo Civic Improvement Club be recognized and utilized
14 so that the marina will be planned in harmony with local as
15 well as territorial planning criteria; now therefore

16 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

17 Section 1. In implementing the marina program authorized
18 for Merizo by Public Law 12-127, the Director of Commerce shall
19 establish an Ad Hoc Planning Committee comprised of public
20 and private planners, and representatives from the Merizo
21 Civic Improvement Club. The Director shall seek the advice of
22 the Committee in all phases of the Merizo Marina Development
23 Program.

1 Section 2. In furtherance of the aforementioned planning
2 process, the marina shall be located, designed, constructed
3 and managed in a manner which will best serve the following
4 criteria:

5 (a) The interests and needs of the people of Merizo
6 are of primary concern and the residents of Merizo shall
7 serve an active role in planning the Marina;

8 (b) The Marina shall be an integral and complimenting
9 part of the overall development plan for Merizo; and

10 (c) The environmental, historical and cultural
11 integrity of the village of Merizo and off-shore waters
12 shall be preserved and protected.

13 Section 3. Merizo Marina Fund. There is hereby established
14 a separate fund to be known as the "Merizo Marina Fund". The
15 Treasurer of Guam is hereby authorized to accept for the Fund
16 appropriations, gifts, devises, bequests, donations and all
17 other kinds of contributions. All monies transferred into the
18 Fund shall be used exclusively and without exception for the
19 planning and construction of the Merizo Marina, and no funds
20 shall be expended unless pursuant to an appropriation act. In
21 administering this fund, the provisions of Chapter III, Title
22 VII of the Government Code of Guam are hereby made applicable.

23 Section 4. Notwithstanding any other provisions of law to
24 the contrary, Federal funding under ESAA (Emergency School Aid
25 Act) for 1974 for Chamorro Language and Culture Program and
26 DISTAR is hereby carried over into fiscal year 1975 until
27 fully expended as follows:

28 A. Chamorro Language and Culture Program

29 For Contractual Services:

30 Instruction for Staff Development,

31 not to exceed

\$1,000
