



CERTIFICATION OF PASSAGE OF AN ACT TO THE GOVERNOR

AN ACT TO ADD SECTION 11839.1 TO THE
GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM TO AUTHORIZE
THE BOARD OF REGENTS OF THE UNIVERSITY
OF GUAM TO ENTER INTO A RECIPROCAL
AGREEMENT WITH THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII
AND COMMUNITY COLLEGES OF THE STATE OF
HAWAII, WHEREBY QUALIFIED STUDENTS OF
BOTH JURISDICTIONS MAY BE ALLOWED TO
ENROLL WITH A GUARANTEE OF WAIVER OF
NON-RESIDENT TUITION.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Section 11839.1 is hereby added to the Govern-
3 ment Code of Guam to read as follows:

4 "Section 11839.1. The Board of Regents of the
5 University of Guam is hereby authorized to enter into a
6 reciprocal agreement with the University of Hawaii and
7 with the community colleges of the State of Hawaii,
8 whereby qualified students of both jurisdictions may be
9 allowed to enroll with a guarantee of a waiver of non-
10 resident tuition, provided, however, that the Board of
11 Regents is hereby authorized to promulgate reasonable
12 rules and regulations regarding implementation of this
13 section."
