AN ACT TO AMEND THE INDEPENDENT SPECIAL PROSECUTOR ACT OF 1974 TO INCLUDE WITHIN THE JURISDICTION OF THE INDEPENDENT SPECIAL PROSECUTOR MEMBERS OF THE LEGISLATURE.

WHEREAS, the Attorney General of Guam has stated publicly that he will not prosecute officials of the government of Guam for alleged crimes committed thereby; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the Legislature, therefore, to include all officials of the government of Guam within the jurisdiction of the Prosecutor established by the Independent Prosecutor Act of 1974; now therefore

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. Subsections (a) and (b) of Section 2 of the

Independent Special Prosecutor Act of 1974 are hereby amended
to read as follows:

- "(a) Serious allegations of illegal acts of high officials of the Executive and Legislative Branches of the government of Guam cannot under present extraordinary circumstances be fully and properly investigated and prosecuted by the Executive Branch itself.
- (b) Public confidence in the integrity of the territory's criminal justice system cannot be maintained if the investigation of such allegations and prosecution of illegal acts by high officials of the Executive and .

 Legislative Branches of the government are carried out

1 under the authority of the Executive Branch itself." Section 2. Section 5 of the Independent Special Prosecutor 2 Act of 1974 is hereby amended to read as follows: 3 "Section 5. Duties. The Special Prosecutor is 11 authorized and directed and shall have exclusive juris-5 diction, to investigate, as he deems appropriate, and 6 prosecute against and in the name of the government of 7 8 Guam: (1) Offenses alleged to have been committed 9 10 by any Governor, Lieutenant Governor, member of the Legislature, or gubernatorial appointee, or members 11 of the staff and employees of any of the aforementioned 12 13 persons while such person is holding any such office; 14 and (2) Offenses relating to or arising out of 15 any such matters, including offenses alleged to have 16 17 been committed by close relatives of such executive officers or members of the Legislature." 18 Section 3. Subsection (c)(1) of Section 16 of the 19 Independent Special Prosecutor Act of 1974 is hereby amended 20 to read as follows: 21

relief against interference with the performance of his duties to which the Special Prosecutor appointed under this Act may be entitled, he may bring an action for injunctive relief against any interference, or threatened interference, with the performance of his duties or with his exclusive jurisdiction under this Act, or against failure to cooperate with him as required by this Act, by any officer of the executive or legislative departments of the government of Guam. Any defense to such action which challenges the authority of the Special

Prosecutor under the laws of Guam, or otherwise calls
into question the legality of this Act shall be interposed
within twenty (20) days of the filing of the complaint."
