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"Section 13. Subsection (a) of Section 6118 of the Government Code of Guam is hereby amended by adding a new Paragraph (5) to read as follows:

(5) Involve the government of Guam in any contract or other obligation for the payment of money in support of, or against the enactment of any measure pending before the Legislature. Nothing in this paragraph shall be deemed to preclude the presentation of testimony before any committee of the Legislature by authorized representatives of the various departments, agencies, commissions, boards, or other political subdivisions of the government of Guam in support of, or against the enactment of any measure pending before the Legislature."

Section 5. There is hereby appropriated the sum of One Thousand Eight Hundred Dollars (\$1,800) to be used for the purpose of reimbursing the Green Acres 4-H Club for expenses incurred in traveling to Honolulu for an official 4-H Seminar.

Section 6. There is hereby appropriated the sum of Twelve Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$12,500) for the purpose of purchasing five (5) Student Driver Education cars, two (2) for John F. Kennedy High School, two (2) for George Washington Senior High School, and one (1) for Vocational Trade and Technical High School; provided, however, that said vehicles shall not be used for other purposes than that of Student Driver Education Programs.

Section 7. The sum of Ten-Thousand Dollars (\$10,000) is hereby appropriated for the purpose of compensating Guam's delegate to the United States House of Representatives for expenses incurred in the discharge of his official duties which are not otherwise provided for by the Federal appropriated funds. All unexpended funds on June 30, 1975 appropriated pursuant to this section are hereby reverted to the Unappropriated Surplus

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of the General Fund.

Section 8. There is hereby appropriated the sum of One Thousand One Hundred Dollars (\$1,100) for transporting fourteen (14) members of the Guam Major League from Guam to Palau and from Palau to Guam to participate in baseball activities.

Section 9. The sum of Twenty-Five Thousand Four Hundred Dollars (\$25,400) is hereby transferred to the General Fund from the Scholarship and Student Loan Fund to satisfy the items of appropriations made by Sections 5, 6, 7, and 8 of this Act.

Section 10. Section 3 of Public Law 12-173 is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 3. Appointment. The Chief Judge of the Superior Court of Guam is authorized and directed to appoint a Special Prosecutor and a Deputy Special Prosecutor with the experience, abilities, and reputation necessary to perform the responsibilities in these offices who shall have the duties and powers prescribed in this Act. The Deputy Special Prosecutor shall have such duties as are assigned by the Special Prosecutor and in his absence shall serve as the Special Prosecutor. The Chief Judge shall establish the salaries for the Special Prosecutor and the Deputy Special Prosecutor."

Section 11. Subsection (1) of Section 5 of Public Law 12-173 is hereby amended to read as follows:

"(1) offenses alleged to have been committed by any Governor, Lieutenant Governor, member of the Legislature, gubernatorial appointee, member of the staff or employee of any of the aforementioned persons, any employee of the Executive or Legislative Branch or any employee of any separate instrumentality within the government of Guam while such person was holding any such office or employment; and"

Section 12. Subsection (4) of Section 6 of Public Law 12-173
is hereby repealed and reenacted to read as follows:

"(4) To make application to the Superior Court for
warrants, subpoenas or other court orders and to grant
immunity from criminal prosecution to any witness when
he determines said grant will be in the best interests of
justice;"
