
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CERTIFICATION OF PASSAGE OF AN ACT TO THE GOVERNOR

AN ACT TO AMEND CERTAIN SECTIONS
OF PUBLIC LAW 12-150 AND FOR OTHER
PURPOSES.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:
2 Section 1. Section 2.III.D. of PART ONE of Public Law
3 12-150 is hereby amended to read as follows:
4 "III. PUBLIC HEALTH AND COMMUNITY SERVICES
5 D. GUAM ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AGENCY
6 1. For Personal Services, not to
7 exceed the total of Four Hundred
8 One Thousand Fifty-Five Dollars
9 (\$401,055) for the positions
10 enumerated in Schedule Twenty-
11 Five of Section 3 of this Act.
12 2. For Personnel Benefits, not to
13 exceed Forty-One Thousand Twenty-
14 Six Dollars (\$41,026) as follows:
15 For contribution to the Retirement
16 Fund, not to exceed \$ 36,512
17 For health and hospital insurance,
18 not to exceed \$ 3,848
19 For life insurance, not to
20 exceed \$ 666
21 3. For Travel and Transportation, not
22 to exceed the total of Sixteen
23 Thousand Six Hundred Thirty-Two

14	For professional library books,

16	For environmental measuring equip-	
17	ment including well monitoring,	
18	land pollution control equip-	
19	ment, noise monitoring equip-	
20	ment and smoke generator, not	
21	to exceed	\$ 9,564
22	For an electronic calculator,	
23	laboratory water softener and	
24	tape recorder, not to exceed	\$ 914
25	For a vehicle (4-door sedan), not	
26	to exceed	\$ 3,000
27	7. The appropriation made pursuant to	
28	Subsections 2.III.D.1 through 2.III.	
29	D.6 shall include Three Hundred	
30	Thirty-One Thousand One Hundred	
31	Forty-Two Dollars (\$331,142) of	
32	Federal Grants-in-Aid."	

1 Section 2. Schedule Twenty-Five of PART ONE Section 3 of
2 Public Law 12-150 is hereby amended to read as follows:

3 "A. ADMINISTRATION

5 One (1) Deputy Administrator at \$18,300 per annum.
6 One (1) Board Secretary at \$11,050 per annum.

Section 3. Items 6 and 7 of Subsection V.B.f. of Section 2, PART ONE of Public Law 12-150 are hereby amended to read as follows:

"B. DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION

f. Vocational Rehabilitation

- 6. For Miscellaneous Items, not to exceed the total of Three Hundred Sixty-Seven Thousand Four Hundred Five Dollars (\$367,405) as follows:
 - For Workshop Center, not to exceed \$333,077
 - For Expansion project in Chamorro Crafts for welfare recipients over 60 years of age \$ 34,328
- 7. The appropriations made pursuant to Subsections 2.V.B.f.1 through 2.V.B.f.6 shall include Seven Hundred Forty-Two Thousand One Hundred Eighty-Six Dollars (\$742,186) of Federal Grants-in-Aid."

Section 4. Section 13 of Public Law 12-181 is hereby amended to read as follows:

1 "Section 13. Subsection (a) of Section 6118 of the Govern-
2 ment Code of Guam is hereby amended by adding a new Paragraph (5)
3 to read as follows:

4 (5) Involve the government of Guam in any contract
5 or other obligation for the payment of money in support of,
6 or against the enactment of any measure pending before the
7 Legislature. Nothing in this paragraph shall be deemed to
8 preclude the presentation of testimony before any committee
9 of the Legislature by authorized representatives of the
10 various departments, agencies, commissions, boards, or
11 other political subdivisions of the government of Guam in
12 support of, or against the enactment of any measure pending
13 before the Legislature."

14 Section 5. There is hereby appropriated the sum of One
15 Thousand Eight Hundred Dollars (\$1,800) to be used for the
16 purpose of reimbursing the Green Acres 4-H Club for expenses
17 incurred in traveling to Honolulu for an official 4-H Seminar.

18 Section 6. There is hereby appropriated the sum of Twelve
19 Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$12,500) for the purpose of
20 purchasing five (5) Student Driver Education cars, two (2)
21 for John F. Kennedy High School, two (2) for George Washington
22 Senior High School, and one (1) for Vocational Trade and
23 Technical High School; provided, however, that said vehicles
24 shall not be used for other purposes than that of Student
25 Driver Education Programs.

26 Section 7. The sum of ~~Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000)~~ ^{Zero} ~~(\$10,000)~~ ⁽⁻⁰⁻⁾ is
27 hereby appropriated for the purpose of compensating Guam's
28 delegate to the United States House of Representatives for
29 expenses incurred in the discharge of his official duties which
30 are not otherwise provided for by the Federal appropriated funds.
31 All unexpended funds on June 30, 1975 appropriated pursuant to
32 this section are hereby reverted to the Unappropriated Surplus

1 of the General Fund.

2 Section 8. There is hereby appropriated the sum of One
3 Thousand One Hundred Dollars (\$1,100) for transporting fourteen
4 (14) members of the Guam Major League from Guam to Palau and
5 from Palau to Guam to participate in baseball activities.

6 Section 9. The sum of Twenty-Five Thousand Four Hundred
7 Dollars (\$25,400) is hereby transferred to the General Fund
8 from the Scholarship and Student Loan Fund to satisfy the items
9 of appropriations made by Sections 5, 6, 7, and 8 of this Act.

10 Section 10. Section 3 of Public Law 12-173 is hereby
11 amended to read as follows:

12 "Section 3. Appointment. The Chief Judge of the
13 Superior Court of Guam is authorized and directed to
14 appoint a Special Prosecutor and a Deputy Special Prosecutor
15 with the experience, abilities, and reputation necessary
16 to perform the responsibilities in these offices who shall
17 have the duties and powers prescribed in this Act. The
18 Deputy Special Prosecutor shall have such duties as are
19 assigned by the Special Prosecutor and in his absence shall
20 serve as the Special Prosecutor. The Chief Judge shall
21 establish the salaries for the Special Prosecutor and the
22 Deputy Special Prosecutor."

23 Section 11. Subsection (1) of Section 5 of Public Law 12-173
24 is hereby amended to read as follows:

25 "(1) offenses alleged to have been committed by any
26 Governor, Lieutenant Governor, member of the Legislature,
27 gubernatorial appointee, member of the staff or employee
28 of any of the aforementioned persons, any employee of the
29 Executive or Legislative Branch or any employee of any
30 separate instrumentality within the government of Guam
31 while such person was holding any such office or employ-
32 ment; and"

1 Section 12. Subsection (4) of Section 6 of Public Law 12-173
2 is hereby repealed and reenacted to read as follows:

3 "(4) To make application to the Superior Court for
4 warrants, subpoenas or other court orders and to grant
5 immunity from criminal prosecution to any witness when
6 he determines said grant will be in the best interests of
7 justice;"
