
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CERTIFICATION OF PASSAGE OF AN ACT TO THE GOVERNOR

AN ACT TO REPEAL AND REENACT SECTION
4106 OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM
AND TO AMEND SECTION 1000.5 OF THE
GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM TO RAISE THE
COMPENSATION PAID CERTAIN MEMBERS OF
THE UNCLASSIFIED SERVICE.

1 WHEREAS, the 12th Guam Legislature hereby finds and
2 declares that the annual rate of compensation paid various
3 members of the unclassified service is deficient in that many
4 members of the classified service as a result of cost of living
5 increases, promotions and reclassifications receive greater
6 compensation than the department heads for whom they are
7 employed; and

8 WHEREAS, as a result of the present compensation scale,
9 many qualified persons both within and without the Government
10 of Guam are reluctant to accept high level management positions
11 at a period in Guam's development where their services and their
12 contributions are most needed; and

13 WHEREAS, the Legislature in enacting this Act is cognizant
14 of the fact that many of the positions not affected deserve to
15 be increased and hereby declares that its failure to so act is
16 based upon lack of information and that when such information
17 becomes available the Legislature shall enact legislation to
18 insure that those persons occupying said positions shall receive
19 compensation based on the necessary skills and qualifications
20 required to adequately perform the tasks required; now therefore

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Section 4106 of the Government Code of Guam
3 is hereby repealed and reenacted to read as follows:

4 "Section 4106. The following unclassified positions
5 within the Executive Branch of the government of Guam are
6 hereby given basic annual compensation as follows:

Section 2. Section 1000.5 of the Government Code of Guam is hereby repealed and reenacted to read as follows:

"Section 1000.5. Legislative compensation. The compensation of each member of the Guam Legislature shall be paid in twenty-six (26) equal installments at the rate of Twenty-Four Thousand Dollars (\$24,000) per annum; the compensation of the Speaker of the Guam Legislature shall be paid in twenty-six (26) equal installments at the rate of Twenty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000) per annum. Such compensation shall be paid out of funds to be appropriated by the Guam Legislature."

Section 3. The Governor of Guam is hereby authorized to appoint persons to fill those positions at Government House which have been deleted from Section 4106 of the Government Code of Guam by Section 1 of this Act, provided that funds have previously been appropriated for such purposes and further provided that such appointments do not violate Section 4116.2 of the Government Code of Guam.

1 Section 4. The amendments to Section 1000.5 (Section 2 of
2 this Act) shall be effective at the commencement of the
3 Thirteenth Guam Legislature.

4 Section 5. Section 1 of this Act shall become effective when
5 an appropriation measure amending the appropriate schedule of
6 Section 3, Part One of P.L. 12-150 to reflect the changes made
7 to the compensation scales by this Act is enacted into Law.
