

AN ACT MAKING A TRANSFER AND APPROPRIATION TO THE GUAM TELEPHONE AUTHORITY FOR CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. There is hereby appropriated from any available balance in the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund the sum of Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000) to be transferred to the Guam Telephone Authority for improvements, extensions, and expansion of telephone facilities.

Section 2. There is hereby appropriated from any available balance in the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund the sum of Nine Hundred Fourteen Thousand One Hundred Sixty-Five Dollars (\$914,165) to the Social Security Insurance Program, pursuant to Section 4204 (C & E), Government Code of Guam, as amended by Public Law 11-135, and Section 210(a) (7) (e) of the Social Security Act, for the period beginning January 1, 1973 to June 30, 1974.

Section 3. There is hereby appropriated from any available balance in the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund the sum of Seven Hundred Seventy-Three Thousand Four Hundred Dollars (\$773,400) to include Grants pursuant to the Hill-Burton Act (Title VI of the Public Health Service Act) of \$696,000 to supplement Section 9 of Public Law 12-114 for the construction of the Northern Area Health Center.

Section 4. The sum of Two Million Nine Hundred Ninety-One Thousand Five Hundred Sixty-Five Dollars (\$2,991,565) is hereby transferred from the Hospital Construction Fund, created by

Section 37, Part One of Public Law 12-60, to the General Fund to satisfy the appropriations made by Sections 1, 2 and 3 of this Act.

Section 5. Effective July 1, 1975, the sum of Two Million Nine Hundred Ninety-One Thousand Five Hundred Sixty-Five Dollars (\$2,991,565) shall be transferred from any available funds in the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund to the Hospital Construction Fund, created by Section 37, Part One of Public Law 12-60.

Section 6. Section 17 and Item U thereunder of Public Law 12-60 are hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 17. The sum of Four Million Seven Hundred Forty-Eight Thousand One Hundred Twenty-Three Dollars (\$4,478,123) is hereby appropriated from any available balance in the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund to be allocated to the following educational facilities:

Section 7. Subsections III.D.1, 2 and 4 of Section 2, Part One of Public Law 12-150 are hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 8. A new Section 27 to Part Twelve of Public Law 12-150 is hereby added to read as follows:

"Section 27. All appropriations made by this Act, and any amendments thereto, for the 'Government of Guam Retirement Fund' shall also be construed as appropriations for contribution to the Social Security Retirement Insurance Program Fund."

Section 9. Subsection 8 of Section 4.I of Part One of Public Law 12-150 is hereby amended to read as follows:

"8. The appropriations made pursuant to Subsections 4.I., 1 through 7, shall include Eighty-Four Thousand One Hundred Fifty-Four Dollars (\$84,154) of Federal Grants-in-Aid. Additionally, the amount of Twenty-One Thousand Seven Hundred Twenty-Eighty Dollars (\$21,728) appropriated pursuant to Subsections 4.II., 11 through 77, from the General Fund is hereby specifically identified as local matching to the Federal Grants-in-Aid (LEAA Funds)."

Section 10. Notwithstanding any other provisions of laws, rules or regulations to the contrary, the Speaker of the Guam Legislature is hereby authorized to reapportion or reallocate any and all appropriations made for the operations of the Twelfth Guam Legislature for the period beginning January 1, 1974 and ending January 12, 1975.

Section 11. Subsection (h) of Section 21603 of the Government Code of Guam is hereby amended to read as follows:

"(h) Enter into contracts with government of the territory, with the United States or with a reputable institution for loans or grants;"

Section 12. Section 21735 of the Government Code of Guam is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 21735. Short term and long term borrowing. The Board may at any time or from time to time, by ordinance adopted by a majority of all members of the Board and approval by the Governor, incur indebtedness for any lawful purpose for any period not to exceed five (5) years for short term loan and fifteen (15) years for long term loan evidenced by contract with any person or by one or more promissory notes. Any such indebtedness shall be incurred subject and subordinate to any contractual obligation of the Board to the holders of any bonds and the principal thereof and interest thereon may be repaid (a) from revenues, or (b) if incurred for a purpose for which bonds may be issued, from revenues or from the proceeds of sale of bonds."

Section 13. Section 7001 of the Government Code of Guam is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 7001. The Department of Law shall have cognizance of all legal matters in which the government of Guam is in anywise interested. Except as otherwise provided by this Section, the Attorney General shall not delegate to any attorney in private practice in Guam the collection of any account or other obligation owing to the government of Guam or to any agency or instrumentality thereof. The Attorney General may contract with private attorneys within the territory of Guam for the prompt collection of debts owed public corporations including but not limited to the Guam Power Authority, Guam Transit Authority, and the Guam Telephone Authority. For purposes of this Section, any attorney who contracts with the Attorney General shall be deemed to be an Assistant Attorney General. It shall have cognizance of all matters

(b) Three Thousand Dollars (\$3,000) to be transferred to the Speaker's Contingency Fund within the Legislature Operations Fund.
